Reflecting on the Gospel

Today we have the gospel that is often seen on signs or car bumpers, John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son." This is the ultimate gift of love for the "world" or us. John also gives us guidance on the best way to respect this gift.

John talks about light and dark. Light being living the truth and honoring the gift of Jesus and dark being doing wicked things which do not honor or respect the gift of God's love.

John talks about this is in terms of absolutes. However, life is usually not lived in absolutes. We have all slips in our behavior or thoughts that lean towards the dark. John suggests that even the most wicked have the opportunity to move into the light.

I am a nurse. Obtaining good health behaviors can be a struggle for us. In our society, we have lots of opportunity to do things that do not support good health: fast food, sweets, taking the elevator instead of the stairs and smoking, to name a few. But we all keep working to make improvements, and often small improvements can have a dramatic effect. Also, when we make a small change, it often leads to other changes. Lose a few pounds, and it is easier to walk, which leads to other improvements.

Similarly, the readings today suggest that when we make moves toward the light, we are met with love and grace from God to help us. John notes that God did not send Jesus to condemn people, but rather to help them find the light and be saved. If we make a move to the light, say join a small group to learn more, it can lead to other moves like improved prayer life, which can lead to other changes.

Lent is a perfect time to reflect on the things that might be preventing you from coming to the light. Just as we can make changes that improve our health, we can make changes to move more toward the light. The Lord will welcome us with grace and love.




