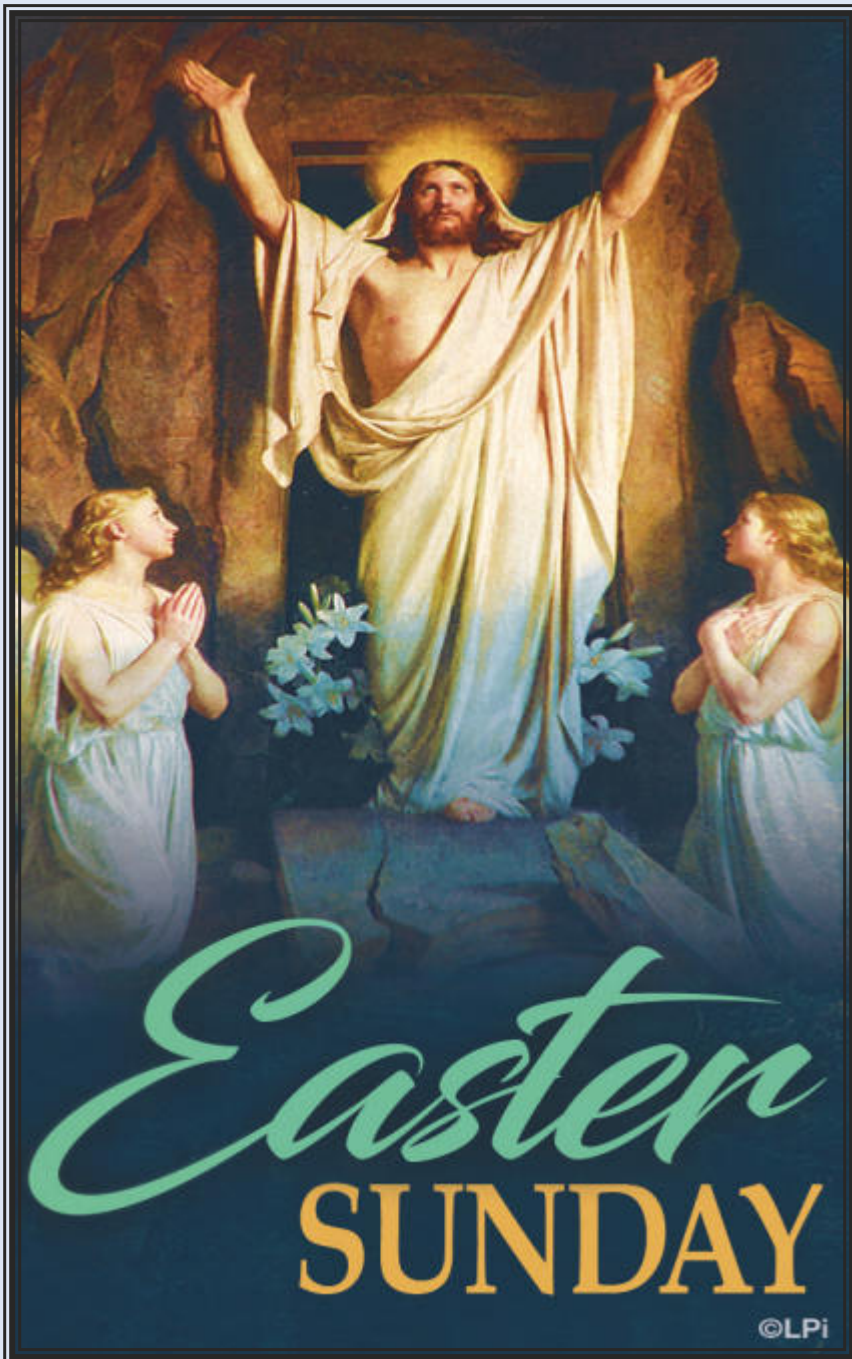

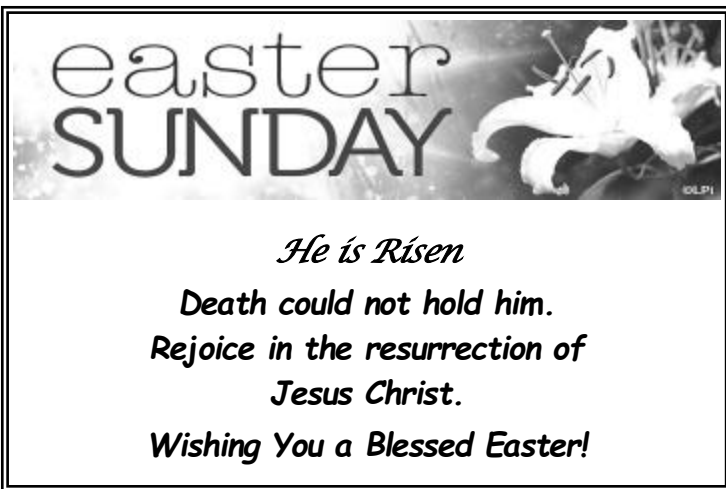

Why Did Jesus Die On The Cross?

One item that is taken up in Christology is: " Why did Jesus die on the cross?" Over the centuries we have had several explanations. Keep in mind a very important point: the explanation is a reflection of the particular time period from which it came. Which of the following did you hear as you were growing up?

The early Christians thought of Jesus' death as a victory over the devil who had gained rights over humans because of their sins. Christ was thought to be the ransom. Because an innocent person died, the devil lost his rights. (That explanation is certainly giving the devil an awful lot of power.) During the first centuries, some in the Roman Empire believed in a god of darkness and a god of light. The Manichees to which St. Augustine belonged at one time was such a group.

The next major explanation came from St. Anselm of Canterbury who wrote the famous book Cur Deus Homo (Why God Became Human). Living in England at the time of the Norman invasion (1066), his explanation reflects the feudal culture that ensued. Anselm believed that sin was an offense against the honor of an infinite God. Human beings being finite could not make sufficient satisfaction. So Jesus freely gives His life for the honor of God. The reward that He was owed was assigned to humanity.

Next week we will consider contemporary theologians thinking on the subject.
