

Usually, our society and nation would have been celebrating Christmas for some time now. But, unless you haven't noticed, the Covid-19 pandemic continues to affect us personally and as a society. There are some who complain about the "supply chain shortages", and the high costs of almost everything. There is a feeling that Christmas will be lacking this year, or even possibly ruined for everyone. The question arises: Is God letting us down, or even punishing us?

I believe there is another possibility to our current realities. Our God, who loves us without any limits, is trying to get us to refocus our spiritual attention on Jesus, the gift of the Father, who comes to be our Savior. Jesus, who comes to love us and forgive all our sins that we can be reconciled to the Father in the Holy Spirit.

Our loving God is trying to get us to be less concerned about our material world and all the things that we would like to possess, and more about gifts that transcend our physical, material world. The gifts of family and friends and those relationships that speak of trust, love, joy, hope, faith, and fun. Naturally, our God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, wants to have such a relationship with us as well.

As Catholic Christians, we can prepare ourselves for the true meaning of Christmas by reading and reflecting on the Bible passages used for the liturgies of Christmas – the mystery of the Incarnation of the Son of God, Jesus Christ, who is Lord and Savior. There are four sets of readings for Christmas. Christmas Vigil Mass: Isaiah 62:1-5; Acts of the Apostles 13:16-17, 22-25: and Matthew 1:1-25. Mass at Midnight: Isaiah 9:1-6; Titus 2:11-14; and Luke 2:1-14. Mass at Dawn: Isaiah 62:11-12; Titus 3:4-7; and Luke 2:15-20. Mass of the Day: Isaiah 52:7-10; Hebrews 1:1-6; and John 1:1-18. While we do not use all of these readings for our Christmas liturgies, by reading and reflecting on them, we gain a fuller understanding of "who" this Jesus is, and why we are called to worship Him, follow Him and obey Him.

Here are a very few of the things said about Jesus Christ our Savior. "They name him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, and Prince of Peace." (Is. 9:5) "The grace of God has appeared," (Titus 2) "When the kindness and generous love of God our savior appeared," (Titus 3) "the Lord restoring Zion. He redeems Jerusalem!" (Is.52) "In these last days, he has spoken to us through the Son, whom he made heir of all things and through whom he created the universe, who is the perfect reflection of his glory, the very imprint of his being, and who sustains all things by his mighty word." (Hebrews 1)

My hope is that all Christians grow in their knowledge and understanding of what we celebrate in this great feast, and that this knowledge will form us into true witnesses of Jesus Christ and the power of His Gospel. May you experience the presence, love and mercy of God in this holy season.
