God's Blessing!

Traditionally, the Feast of Epiphany commemorated three different events. The word Epiphany comes from *epi* - above, *phaino* - to shine - to shine from above. It is a revelation of who God is to us here on Earth. The three events that were seen as "epiphanies" were Christ being revealed to the Magi as a child, Christ being baptized and the voice of the Father being heard, and our Gospel for this day - Christ turning water into wine. Originally, these three events were celebrated on January 6th, but over time these different liturgical celebrations spread throughout the year. But in this liturgical cycle of Year C - the Church consciously places the Wedding Feast of Cana in this cycle of Christ's Epiphanies.

What happens during this feast is that Christ begins the events that will lead to His hour. What is His hour? The Evangelist uses this as code for His Passion on the Cross. It is this action of revealing His glory that will begin the events that lead to the Cross. When Mary asks Christ to help this family in their need, Christ responds, "Woman, how does your concern affect me?" He wants her to know that by making this request, it will culminate in the Cross. Are you ready for this? Mary responds by going to the servers and telling them to do whatever Christ is asking. She responds to Christ's challenge, but trusting that He will respond to the need. That is a good method in our lives in our prayers, when we ask Christ for things in prayer we need to be direct with what the problem is ("They have no wine") and then be faithful to whatever He tells us to do.

Next Saturday our Middle School Youth Group will be having a Survivor Night. If you know any middle schooler - invite them to come join in on the fun. It will be a good way for them to make friends and learn more about who God made them to be. January 22nd following the 5:00 pm Mass. Please let me or Kate MacDonald know if you are going to attend so we can plan accordingly.

Finally, I'll be going on the March for Life next week. The bus leaves at 9:00 pm on Thursday, gets to DC at 9:00 am on Friday, we go on the March, spend the night on the floor in some parish gym, the next day Mass with the bishop in the National Shrine, from which we will return back to Indiana. The bus is supposed to get back at 11:45pm Saturday night. So please pray for all those who are traveling, that our witness to the value of life may help people to understand how good life is in every situation. Until we can change the narrative of what it means to be in a crisis pregnancy - that every child is a gift to be cherished, not a burden to be discarded - no law that is passed will matter.
