## **JANUARY 23, 2022**

#### God's Blessings!

The 3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time is Word of God Sunday. And our Gospel today is a great description of Scripture. We hear the Evangelist Luke give out the purpose of his writing down the Gospel. "Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may realize the certainty of the teachings you have received." Why did he write the Gospel? To write down an orderly sequence of what happened - so that Theophilius - a Greek name meaning Lover of God, so anyone who loves God - may realize the certainty of the teachings handed down. It does not say it is merely myth or hearsay. He has access to other accounts of Christ's ministry and he says he talked to actual eyewitnesses to confirm what actually happened. The Scriptures are not some stories about a made up character, but a real account of something that really happened.


So on this Word of God Sunday - do I make time for God's word in my life? Do I intentionally spend time reading Scripture? In our first reading, we hear about how Ezra merely read the Torah for six hours and the people of Jerusalem gathered and wept as they heard the Word of God. Why? Because they had physically returned from exile in Babylon some 80 years earlier, but they had not spiritually returned. Upon hearing the Word of God they realized the great distance between their own behavior and what God commanded through Moses. But Ezra's goal was not to depress the population, but to encourage repentance. So he strenuously urged the people: "Do not be saddened this day... rejoicing in the Lord must be your strength." Sometimes reading Scripture uplifts us, sometimes it challenges us, but at all times it is helping us to become who God is calling us to be - His beloved children who are called to become great saints. Let us make time for Scripture in our life.

I should be getting back from the March for Life this Saturday at 11:45pm. As I write this, it looks like there is going to be snow on Saturday, so who knows what will happen? Hopefully this will be the last national March for Life as the Supreme Court could move the question of legal rights for children in the womb to the states. In that case, the drive down to Indianapolis will be much easier. But the work of promoting the value of life is never over and we always need to support women in crisis situations, so that by our actions we can change the narrative to reveal the truth that every human life is sacred.

#### LITTLE FLOWER HOLY HOUR


