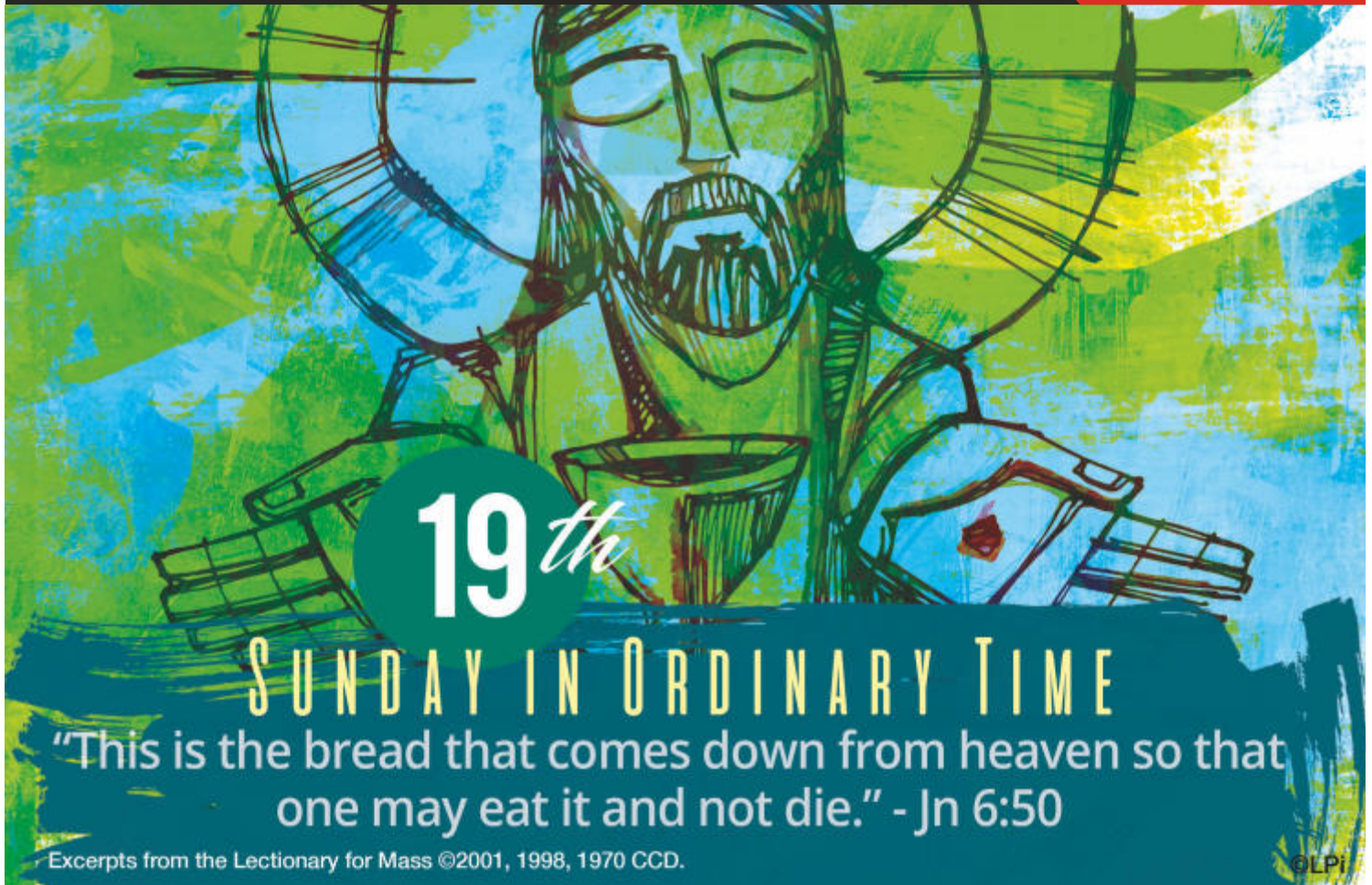

What's Your Hearth Cake?

"Get up and eat, or the journey will be too much for you."

I've been to a lot of meetings in my years of work in the Church, and you can take my word for it: the ones with snacks just seem to go better.

I don't know what it is exactly. Maybe it's just that people are in a more agreeable mood if you show up with donuts. Or maybe it's about the very real sense of community and camaraderie that is created at a table where people are engaging in that most human of tasks – eating – beside one another. Tombstone – the Town Too Tough To Die has one church older than the shootout that gave the town its fame. **Sacred Heart of Jesus Catholic Church** was dedicated January 1, 1881. It is part of the historic tour. tombstonescatholicchurch.org Visit Sedona and view the beautiful **Chapel of the Holy Cross**. The edifice was constructed using reinforced concrete with a ninety foot cross as part of the foundation. Facts for Faithful Kids

1. We celebrate the feasts of many interesting saints this week. **August 9** we remember St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. St. Teresa was born Edith Stein, a daughter in a Jewish family. In her teens, Edith stopped practicing the Jewish faith and she became a Catholic when she was 31. Edith died in a gas chamber during World War II because she had been born Jewish.
2. **August 10** is the feast of St. Lawrence. Although we know very little of his life, his willingness to die for Christ has made his memory last since the 4th century.
3. Do you enjoy watching TV? The patron saint of television is St. Clare and her feast day is **August 11**. St. Clare joined the religious life when she was 18. She never left the walls of her convent after she entered. She spent her days in prayer and work with almost no talking. She is the patron of television because it was reported that while very sick in bed just before dying, she had a vision of the Mass being celebrated in the convent chapel.
4. **August 13** is International Left-Handers Day as designated by Lefthanders International. The day celebrates the joys and frustrations of being left handed. About 10% of humans are left handed. Did you know 8 US Presidents were left handed including Ford, Reagan, George H.W. Bush, Clinton and Obama? There are lots of other famous people who are left handed. One of my favorites is Kermit the Frog (and Jim Henson)! Celebrate your special day if you are left handed.
5. On **August 14** we celebrate a priest who was willing to die for another man. St. Maximilian Kolbe was a priest in Poland before WWII. He was devoted to Our Blessed Mother. When the German army took over Poland, Fr. Kolbe was taken to a concentration camp. Three months later, after a prisoner had escaped, the German commander chose 10 prisoners to die. As they were marched away, Fr. Kolbe stepped forward and said he would take the place of one of the prisoners. He along with the others starved to death. He followed Jesus – he laid down his life for others.
