# **Catholics on Vacation**

This week we explore New Mexico. The resource is **Monuments**, **Marvels**, and **Miracles A Traveler's Guide to Catholic America** by Marion Amberg.

One of the oldest buildings in Ranchos de Taos constructed of mud and straw adobe bricks in 1815 is **San Francisco de Asis Church**. The church is on the National Historic Register. Visitors can make an appointment to see the famous "Mystery Painting" called The Shadow of the Cross, painted by Henri Ault. In daylight, the subject is Jesus standing on the Sea of Galilee. In darkness, a luminous cross appears above the left shoulder of Christ. Researchers have been unable to explain this phenomenon. (sfranchos.org)

It takes a thirteen-mile ride on dirt road to reach the **Monastery** of **Christ in the Desert**. This Benedictine Monastery is located

in a canyon north of Abiquiu along the Chama River. There is an adobe chapel and Byzantine-style tabernacle shrine embellished with gold leaf. <u>(christdesert.org)</u>

Visitors can see the convent built by Servant of God Sr. Blandina at **San Felipe de Neri Church** in Albuquerque. A vigorous missionary, Sr. Blandina famously stopped Billy the Kid from robbing a stagecoach, prevented a lynching and met with the leaders of the Comanche and Apache nations. (sanfelipedeneri.org)

# **Facts for Faithful Kids**

**1.** Some people are very good and some people are very bad. **August 25** is the birthday of two men. French king Louis VIII was such a good king and person that he became a saint. The czar of Russia was such a mean man that he became known as Ivan the Terrible. Try to follow the example of Louis instead of Ivan.

2. Have you ever heard of a volcano named Vesuvius? It is in southern Italy and is the only remaining active volcano on the mainland of Europe. On **August 24 and 25** in the year 79, the volcano erupted, sending hot cases and molten lava down the mountainside. Below the volcano were two cities, Pompeii and Herculaneum and each were destroyed. Sadly, many people died in the blast. However, because of the ash, archeologists have been able to dig into the remains and find many items used during that time.

**3. August 27 and 28** are the feasts of a mother and her son. St. Monica prayed for her son Augustine every day because he did not believe in Jesus. She wanted him to be baptized but he said no. Monica kept praying. One day, Augustine had a change of heart. He knew that God was calling him to be His disciple. Augustine became a priest, bishop and leader of the church. Follow St. Monica's example when you want God to answer your prayers – keep praying.

**4. August 27** is the birthday of Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu. Born in Skopje, Yugoslavia in 1910, Agnes became a nun at the age of 18 and took the name Teresa. She joined the Sisters of Loreto and was sent as a missionary to Calcutta, India. Sr. Teresa again heard God calling her to work with the poor and dying. She started a new order of nuns called the Missionaries of Charity. Teresa became known as Mother Teresa of Calcutta and won the Nobel Peace Prize for her work.
