Father's Day



My Brothers and Sisters in God's Holy Spirit,

Today we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the ways in which the Spirit inspires, guides and strengthens us to live as Christian Disciples. Today is the 50th and final day of the Easter season. The season of Easter culminates with this special day, Pentecost, in which we thank God for the gift of His Spirit along with the challenge to be open to the Spirit's movements and stirrings within us and around us.

Once there was this very rich, good old Texan who threw a big Texas sized bash for his daughter. Now he was a very rich Texan with tens of thousands of acres of land, thousands of cattle, hundreds of producing oil wells and huge 29 room mansion complete with an olympic sized swimming pool, and of course, his beautiful young daughter.

For this party he invited all the eligible young men of the county to meet his daughter. After a few hours of the party, he called everyone out to the pool for an announcement. He lined up all the young men at one end of the pool, which he had filled with snakes and alligators. He said, "The first one of you who jumps into the pool and swims to the other end, I will give him the choice of one million dollars, a thousand acres of choice land, or the hand of my daughter in marriage."

No sooner were the words out of the Texan's mouth when there was a splash at the far end and a streak through the water. A young man emerged, setting what must have equaled an Olympic record.

The Texan approached the young man and asked if he wanted the million dollars. The young guy said, "No sir." The he was asked if he wanted the thousand acres. Again the young man said, "No." "Well then son," said the Texan, "you must want the hand of my lovely daughter in marriage?" "Thank you, but no, sir," replied the young guy.

"Well then just what is it that you do want?" The young man replied, "What I want, sir, is to know the name of the dude who pushed me in the pool!"

I share this story with you because sometimes it's the Holy Spirit that pushes us into that pool, a situation that we wouldn't dream of entering. We like to be comfortable and we don't like to be out of our comfort zone. And yet there are times when the Holy Spirit gives us a push, a nudge, to do what God asks us to do. There may not be snakes and alligators in God's plan for us, but there are often many challenges. Are we willing to follow the Spirit's call? Something to think about this Pentecost.

Early Christians had an appreciation for the goose's unexpected interventions, and saw the goose as a fitting symbol for the Spirit. The Holy Spirit can be as gentle as a dove, or rambunctious and unpredictable as a wild goose.

The gift of the Holy Spirit is not merely something reserved for Confirmation. The *Spirit* desires a relationship with us that will take us on the greatest adventure imaginable: a journey to the very heart of *God*.

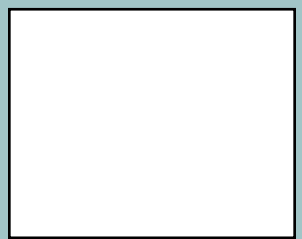

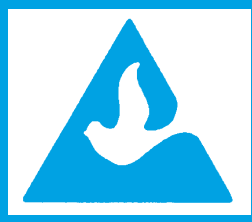
