FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN.....

Dear Parishioners,


Happy New Year! Hopefully your 2022 is off to a good start! As we begin this new year and continue our celebration of the Christmas season, this weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. Often with this feast, we focus on the magi and the gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, or on the humility of three kings who did homage to the Child Jesus, but perhaps this year we could focus on the star. Much has been said about this star throughout the history of theology, but perhaps we ought to focus on what it did. If we pay attention, we will see that the star guided the magi. The magi, as gentiles from afar represent all of humanity, and so the star guided all of humanity to the Child Jesus. The star for us is a symbol of our call to evangelize, that is bring people to Jesus.

During 2022 and beyond, our Archbishop is asking the Archdiocese to focus on deepening our relationship with the Lord, so that we can discern how He is calling us to evangelize as individuals and as a people. So as we begin this new year, perhaps our first resolution ought to be to grow in relationship with Jesus so that we might become better instruments, like the star, to bring people to Him. Two good ways we can do this are prayer and study. Study is easy, just find a good book about our faith and start to read it, even if it's just a little at a time. Prayer is simple, but it's not always easy for us to do. Take 10-15 minutes a day, put it in your calendar if you have to, and just spend it speaking with God about your struggles and joys, desires and hopes, and then simply ask Him to speak, and wait patiently in the quiet. He will speak in some way and in His time. These two simple practices can help us to become like the star in this weekend's Gospel. They can help us to grow closer to the Lord and to bring people to Him.



Feast of Epiphany TRADITONAL HOUSE BLESSING

There is a long-standing Catholic tradition of blessing the home on the Feast of Epiphany. This year, we invite you to adopt this custom in your family. It is a wonderful way to begin the New Year, with the family gathering to ask God's blessing on their home and all those who visit. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, and to be with us in our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, our joys and sorrows.

The most common way of doing this is to use a simple stick of chalk to write above the home's entrance, 20 + C + M + B + 22. The letters C, M, B have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the three magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They also abbreviate the Latin words Christus Mansionem Benedicat, "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross and 2022 is the year.

Instructions for Blessing the Home:

Using the blessed chalk mark the lintel of your front door (or front porch step) 20 + C + M + B + 22 while saying:

The three Wise Men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar followed the star of God's Son who became human two thousand and nineteen years ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout the New Year. Amen.

Then offer the following prayer:

Visit, O blessed Lord, this home with the gladness of your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love; and grant that we may manifest your love to each other and to all whose lives we touch. May we grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of you; guide, comfort, and strengthen us in peace, O Jesus Christ, now and forever. Amen

"Chalking the door" is a way to celebrate and literally mark the occasion of the Epiphany and God's blessing of our lives and home. With time the chalk will fade. As it does, we let the meaning of the symbols written sink into the depths of our heart and be manifest in our words and actions the Latin words, Christus Mansionem Benedictat, "May Christ bless the house."



Inspiration for the week

Human beings easily get bored. Life's routines can become so predictable that there is often little time for excitement or freshness. Today is all about the new and the wonderful. In celebrating the beauty and simplicity of the Epiphany, we see in tangible ways God's creative, redemptive, and restorative power. This refreshment and revitalization is offered not only to a select few but to everyone throughout the world. There is nothing routine or static about God. Surprises, wonders, miracles, opportunities, healings, and joy without measure are available to those who believe. There are never any endings, just beginnings. And, when darkness, boredom, and gloom seem to be the order of the day, a bright new light now shines pointing us to truth and reminding us that we are loved.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint."


