FROM THE DESK OF FR. JIM,

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend is an important weekend for us as American Catholics. This Saturday, January 22nd, is the 49th anniversary of the Roe v. Wade decision which was handed down by the Supreme Court legalizing abortion throughout the country. As you all know, this is an extremely contentious issue in our society today, especially with challenges to abortion recently having been heard by the Supreme Court. Every year on this anniversary, people throughout the country gather and rally, march and pray, offering peaceful protest against an offense which is anything but peaceful. Millions pray and hope, every day and every year that there might be an end to abortion, and as faithful followers of Jesus, each of us should join in these hopeful prayers for the legal protection of the unborn. We also ought to pray for mothers in difficult situations, for mothers (and fathers) who have had an abortion, and for unborn children who are in danger of abortion. As a child, I began to pray nightly for an end to abortion, especially with the following prayer of spiritual adoption promoted by Archbishop Fulton Sheen: "Jesus, Mary and Joseph, I love you very much. I beg you to spare the life of the unborn baby that I have spiritually adopted who is in danger of abortion. Amen."

The other thing we ought to pray for as Catholics, is conversion of heart, first for ourselves, and then for others and our whole culture. Early in my time in seminary, we had a guest lecture by the late Justice Antonin Scalia. Among the many things of which he spoke, abortion is the one I remember the most because he said something really important. He mentioned that the government can make laws and that the courts could overturn or uphold them; but he pointed out to us that, even should Roe v. Wade be overturned, it wouldn't be enough because the culture must be converted. He said conversion is not the realm of the courts but that of the faithful. This year, as we solemnly remember the anniversary of Roe v. Wade, many are doing so with renewed hope that the laws might change. What a blessing that would be! However, we still have more work to do, and even more of an uphill battle than this 49 year fight.

As disciples of Jesus we need to pray for the conversion of our culture, which our recent popes have called a culture of death, a throw away culture rooted in selfishness. The best starting point is to pray first for our own conversion of heart, daily asking the Lord to root out our own selfishness, that we might have selfless hearts to contribute to a culture of life and love. Of course action is needed too, so a simple suggestion: we have a great pregnancy assistance center here in Washington, which our Lifeline Coalition supports. They do so much great work helping young mothers in difficult situations and could always use whatever support we can offer.

LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

People can easily lose a sense of the sacred and transcendent. When we lose a sense of God's special presence, we need to be brought back. Ezra brought people back to the word of God and they realized what they were missing. Jesus proclaims God's word in the synagogue with true conviction and tells those gathered that he is the fulfillment of all that Isaiah taught. Even though people get lost, distracted, discouraged, and often journey down the wrong path, God's timeless law remains. When we allow ourselves to truly hear God's word and act on it, that living word slowly, over time, changes us. It has the power to soften and mold us, creating within us a joyful spirit. We realize the truth in what God speaks and become open to God's love. Gradually and gently God leads us back where we belong. We discover again the sacred character of life and the wonder of God's power. It is no wonder that Luke addresses his remarks to Theophilus. It is a name that means "beloved of God," a name that can be used by anyone who desires friendship with God.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

One of the most famous members of the Dominican Order, St. Thomas Aquinas (1225 -1274) is well-known by many for his theological work, "The Summa Theologiae." Born in Italy, his mother wanted him to become a Benedictine and had high hopes that he would eventually become abbot of Monte Cassino, where he spent much of his youth. To change his vocation, she had him kidnapped by his brothers on his way to Paris at the age of 19. He spent two years in their captivity. Despite this, nothing could shake him from his vocation to become a Dominican priest and he was eventually released. Once free, he went to Paris and then to Cologne, where he finished his studies with Albert the Great.

His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, encompasses his writings. The Summa Theologiae, his last and, unfortunately, uncompleted work, deals with the whole of Catholic theology.

The patron saint of teachers, theologians and students, St. Thomas Aquinas died in 1274. His life and the impact he had on the whole Church, however, remains alive today.
