FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK....

Dear Parishioners,

One of the things that has struck me about the readings at the beginning of the season of Lent is that they are very focused on service. They are clear that our interior conversion of heart must have an outward effect, and of course this makes perfect sense. It's good for us to be reminded. God Himself doesn't just keep to Himself up in heaven, His love is so great that it must go out. In the Person of Jesus Christ, He enters into the very depths of human suffering, seeking the lost, and restoring us to relationship with the Father. Therefore He gives us a model for what our Lenten conversion should look like. Inner conversion leads to exterior effects such as service to neighbor. Something good for all of us to reflect upon this Lent, especially with the war raging in Ukraine and all of the other unrest throughout the world. It would be easy for us to just close ourselves off from others in a sort of selfpreservation, but Jesus calls us to give of ourselves, even sacrifice ourselves for love of others. May the Lord grant us this type of conversion of heart, one that spreads His love and light in this world.

Speaking of service, you should all know that one of our parishioners has been recognized by the Archdiocese for her commitment to service. Hannah Menges, an OLL parishioner and a senior at St. Francis Borgia High School, was honored last Monday evening at the Cathedral Basilica with the Archbishop John L. May Service Award presented by Archbishop Rozanski.

Congratulations to Hannah and to her parents, Bryan and Dawn!

As we continue this season of Lent, hopefully you have settled into a good routine for your spiritual growth. I'd like to highlight a few opportunities for continued spiritual growth and Lenten discipline. First of all, the Sacrament of Reconciliation is available on Saturdays from 4-4:45pm and on Wednesdays from 5-6pm. I will be adding times as Lent continues. I'd also make note now that our upcoming Lenten Combined Penance Service (with St. Francis Borgia Parish) will be here at OLL starting at 6:30pm on Monday March 28th.

Another great opportunity for Lent was born out of two different things. For the last couple of years, the seminarians have been helping me host and lead Sunday evening holy hours with evening prayer and benediction during Lent. This year, without a seminarian, I was considering what we could do and decided that I would offer a retreat on Lenten Sundays instead. I had been asked to lead a retreat at the Archdiocesan Catholic Renewal Center on March 18-19, and I decided that ...

... I would give a version of that retreat over the course of four weeks here beginning this Sunday March 13th after the 10am mass. The retreat is entitled "The Servant Knows the Father's Heart" and will consist of a weekly talk, time for personal prayer and prayer points for the week ahead to help us pray through this season of Lent. All are welcome to attend this retreat. Please pray that it is a time of renewal for all who attend!

Finally, as I mentioned above, I will be giving the retreat at the Catholic Renewal Center next weekend.

Therefore, there will be no 8am mass on Saturday,

March 19th.
