Dear Parishioners,

As we continue the Lenten season, I'd just like to highlight a few opportunities this coming week for your spiritual growth. First of all, as usual we have confessions on Wednesday evening from 5pm to 6pm and then again on Saturday from 4-4:45pm. Next Monday, March 28th, we will have our Lenten Penance Service here at

OLL at 6:30pm. In addition, we have a short lenten retreat talk and then some time for adoration of the Blessed Sacrament this Sunday and next at 11:15am. The theme of this retreat is coming to know the Father's Heart. I am hopeful that it will help people dive more deeply into prayer and their relationship with the Lord. All are invited.

On another note, I have mentioned the last few weeks at mass the need to fill out the survey for *All Things New*. The survey is called the Disciple Maker Index and is intended for all Catholics ages 18 and up. It is really important that as many parishioners as possible take this survey. It is intended to gauge where we are in our Catholic belief and practice and where were are as a parish in terms of living out the mission of Jesus through our ministries. The more honest surveys we have, the more accurate information we will have to best assess the way forward. I know many people are of the mind that *All Things New* will affect other areas of the Archdiocese, but will not affect ours. I can assure you that this opinion is not true. We are fast approaching a precipice in the Archdiocese on many fronts and need to plan for a future of hope and renewed faith practice. For example, we currently have 187 parishes in the Archdiocese. According to projections, we will have 130 active diocesan priests in ten years. 187 parishes with only 130 priests is untenable for a Church centered on the Eucharist and the Sacraments. Something must be done, and if we are serious about evangelization, something bold must be done. There will be change throughout the entire Archdiocese, in every parish, including ours. Change is difficult, but I believe this change can be good, after all, the Resurrection happened only after the Cross. At this point in the process, there are two things we can do to affect positive change.

First, we can pray. Prayer is the most powerful gift we have, so pray. Pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Pray for the gifts of courage and discernment. Pray that the Lord's hand might guide this process for the good and salvation of the faithful of our Archdiocese and for the evangelization of our neighbors and friends. Second, we can participate in the Disciple Maker Index survey. There will be further opportunities for parishioner input, but this is the first opportunity and it is very important to get this process off on the right foot. 1st & 3rd Graders are listening to a presentation this week from the Bank of Washington about teaching the children how to save.







STOKING THE LENTEN FIRE

I think we all can acknowledge that there's a certain fatigue that comes over us all as we near the end of the Lenten season. Next week is Laetare Sunday, and I find that as soon as those pink vestments start coming out of storage, our collective motivation begins to wane.

I get that. Maybe you're fatigued — I am, too. Maybe you're doing well in your resolutions and devotions but you're in danger of coasting. Or maybe, like many of us this year or in past years, you don't feel that you have even really begun your Lenten journey.

Either way, chances are that the fire that was in your belly on Ash Wednesday is burning a bit

low. All fires eventually do, once they consume whatever fuels them. So here we would do well to remember what fuels our Lenten fire.

Sometimes we make resolutions that have the appearance of being spiritual, but also have an earthly motive. We give up chocolate hoping to lose weight. We stop gossiping so our friends may like us more. There is nothing wrong with these sacrifices — just with their motivations.

As Moses removes his sandals to approach the burning bush, he sees that the fire burns brightly, strongly — but does not consume. It is propelled by something inexhaustible, something which is not of this world.

Is your Lenten fire fueled by God? Are you daily surrendering yourself to the same voice that boomed from the bush in Genesis — the voice that commanded the Israelites to do what seemed like the impossible?



WHY DO PRIESTS WEAR VESTMENTS? DO THEY HAVE A SPECIAL MEANING?

Vestments are clothes worn for a specific purpose. Priests will joke that they cover a thousand flaws. But our own manner of dress often corresponds to what we do. We dress up for special occasions, and for special guests. We wear certain clothes for golf, for outdoor activities, and years ago, we even had our "Sunday best" clothes we wore just for Church. Vestments are much the sa me, and each one has a meaning. The alb is a reminder of the baptismal garment. The stole is a symbol of ordained ministry and authority within the Church. The chasuble reminds us that we are on a pilgrimage of faith, passing through this life towards heaven.

Priests wear vestments for two basic reasons. First, they draw attention to the importance and solemnity of the act of worship. The color of the vestments indicates the season of the year or the feast being celebrated. Secondly,

vestments draw attention to what the priest does, rather than who he is. In the celebration of the Mass, the focus is on what we do together, on our common unity, and on the mystery and person of Christ.


