#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. JIM...

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we enter into Holy Week which, of course, is the holiest time of the year for us Catholics. As we begin this solemn time, I'd like to reflect on two words; **"enter in."** One of the most incredible moments of our liturgical year is when we all participate in the reading of the Holy Gospel this weekend. The response, "crucify Him, crucify Him" is hauntingly powerful as we all repeat verbally what we have called for with our actions. Our sins have crucified Our Lord. They are a participation in the events we commemorate this week. By our sins we have participated, and by our voices in this liturgy we enter into this mystery, honestly calling to mind the sins by which we have crucified Him so that His Death and Resurrection might redeem us and bring us to new life in Him here on earth and eventually in heaven.

The whole of Holy Week, liturgically and spiritually, is an entering into the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus, which we call the Paschal Mystery. This week, I encourage each of you to **enter in** in whatever way is possible for you. The two best ways are by going to confession, if you haven't done so recently, and by prayerfully attending the liturgies of Holy Week. The final two confession times for this week are Monday from 7-8:30pm and Wednesday from 5-6pm. Once again, there will be no confessions at 4pm or mass at 5pm on Saturday since it is Holy Saturday.

Monday through Wednesday of this week, we will celebrate mass at 8am as usual. Thursday through Saturday we will have morning prayer at 8am. Thursday evening our Mass of the Lord's Supper will be at 7:30pm. Friday afternoon our Celebration of the Lord's Passion will be at 3pm. And Saturday our celebration of the Easter Vigil will be at 8pm. Easter Sunday masses will be at 8am and 10am.

One final point for our **entering in** this week; atmosphere matters. It is very easy to make this week just like any other week, but of course that would not be an **entering into** the holiness of the time. One way to avoid that and to consecrate this time is to create an atmosphere of prayer and solemn reflection for the week. Maybe simply turning off the TV and avoiding social media would be helpful. Or perhaps eating more simple, penitential meals. Smaller portions and avoidance of the more tasty things such as red meat or dessert could be a way to do this. Of course, we could perhaps read something holy, such as Scripture or a book about a saint, or we could watch a Catholic film on <u>Formed.org</u>. Whatever we can do to create a "holy atmosphere" this week will help us to **enter into** these mysteries of our salvation.






