FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK....

Dear Parishioners,


Where does the time go? Next weekend is already the unofficial start of summer as we celebrate Memorial Day, and there's much to say about that! First, keep all school students and faculty in your prayers as they begin their summer break. Our students here at OLL are excited that "school's out for summer" on this

Tuesday, May 24th. Special thanks to our principal Mrs. Ann Joyce and the whole faculty and staff for another great year! Second, as we celebrate Memorial Day let's remember what it's all about, namely those who died in service of our country. Make sure to take some time to pray for the repose of their souls and for the families who mourn them. We will do that here at OLL at Mass at 9am on Memorial Day. Third, next weekend is a big weekend for us here at OLL. Another of our former seminarian interns, Deacon Donald Morris, will be ordained to the priesthood next Saturday, May 28th. If you have never been to an ordination, this would be a great time to go to one and witness two men lay down their lives for the Church. The ordination will be at 10am at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis and all of you are certainly welcome to attend. That evening, I will have a visiting priest cover confessions and 5pm Mass for me so that I can attend Fr. Morris' family celebrations. Please keep Deacon Morris in your prayers as he continues to prepare for ordination next weekend.

On another note, the Catholic Church has been in the national spotlight lately because of the leaked draft opinion from the Supreme Court's Dobbs v Jackson Women's Health Organization. As you well know, this leak has caused quite a political uproar in our country resulting in some vitriol aimed at the Catholic Church for her unwavering stance in defense of the dignity of every human life from conception to natural death. Should the case be decided in continuity with the leaked opinion resulting in the overturning of the infamous Roe v Wade decision, there will no doubt be an increased hatred spewed at our Church. With that in mind, I'd like to point out a few things that perhaps get blurred by the heightened tensions around this conversation. First of all, it is the consistent teaching and belief of the Catholic Church that abortion, as the intentional taking of an innocent human life, is always and everywhere a grave moral evil. For that reason, the Church has always stood against legalized abortion, in this country and around the world, which leads me to my second point. The Church, though boldly at times, always takes such a stand peacefully and through the lens of mercy. To be clear, that means we are called to stand up for the truth, but never with violence, unless of course it is in selfdefense. And mercy must be a part of the conversation in two ways. First, in that we condemn actions, not persons. Our ideological opponents are still children of God and we need to entrust them to His Mercy regardless of how they treat us or the vulnerable. Secondly, mercy must be a part of the conversation in the sense that we seek to help those in need. It is not enough for us to stand against abortion because mercy demands more than standing on principle. Mercy demands that we care for the needy and vulnerable, in this case mothers in crisis pregnancies, mothers and babies in need, and those harmed by the aftermath of abortion. Quietly the Church has been helping to bring about healing after an abortion, or to help those in crisis pregnancies or situations in our country for years. We need to continue this in the aftermath of the Dobbs decision and we need to redouble our efforts at the works of mercy in those situations that surround abortion. Finally, we need to pray, even more than we have in the past. Pray for an end, not only to legalized abortion, but ultimately to the deep wounds in our culture that have led us to accept such a terrible tragedy as a solution to a problem.


Happy last week of school!







Dynamic Catholic, Alive! - Keep my Word

In the Gospel, Jesus said to His disciples, "Whoever loves me will keep My word." Sometimes it is easy for us to forget that "keeping" or living the word of God doesn't just mean that we live it on Sunday. Jesus is calling us to live God's word each day of our lives. Jesus didn't say that we get to pick and choose which of His words we live and which we set aside. We can see through Jesus' example and the example of His disciples that living His word is radical. Living His word is counter cultural. It takes commitment, perseverance, and fortitude, but that is why Jesus gave us the powerful gifts of the Sacraments, grace, and most of all the Holy Spirit. When we accept these gifts there is no reason we can't answer Jesus' call to fuse our will to His. The good news is that living God's word leads to authentic and lasting love, joy, and peace. This week we can meditate on how we are answering Jesus' call to live His word every day of our lives. We can ask ourselves when we have failed to do this. Then we can pray for Jesus' guidance and assistance to fully answer His call.
