Nowadays we hear a lot about chaos and disorder. The current pandemic has led us all to a direction that none of us expected. Many of us have been forced to work from home, study from home and do everything at home. It's funny to see videos on the internet where people are wearing their nice shirt and tie and at the same time wearing their pajamas bottoms and a pair of slippers below the waist. These are just a few ways in which we can connect and keep our relationships strong during these days where we cannot be socially together.

My recommendation though is that we stick to the gifts of new technology that can truly be a great help for humanity. By that I mean, making plans that would help us and others from being isolated and alone. Perhaps, instead of texting, plan to call and have a real conversation with friends and loved ones. There are several apps now that also enable us to see each other while having a conversation. I would even recommend planning a family Rosary together or a prayer meeting with a friend or a group of friends.

Our parish has now provided several events where we can join in a live holy hour with music. Soon we are hoping to be able to begin our 33 Day preparation as we consecrate ourselves to Saint Joseph. We will also be given an opportunity to get together both virtually and in person for our Lenten observances. I hope that we can all take part in these programs where we can truly be a part of a vibrant community despite the challenges of the pandemic. We are hoping that these can help you from feeling isolated from our community because you are very much a part of us with Christ as our leader.

St. Rita Home & School Calendar Raffle Fun Facts



The **2020** annual Home & School calendar raffle generated **\$16,000** in profit. Total payouts were **\$14,175** to the winners. There were 315 different winning tickets pulled, 46 of them were pulled twice and one lucky ticket was pulled 5 times! The person with that one lucky ticket actually won another time on a second ticket they purchased, so they had 6 winners in total for the year! In fact most of you buy more than one ticket and it does increase your odds of winning. When counting winnings on multiple tickets 83 people won twice, 13 people won 3 times, 2 of you won four times, and again we had a lucky 6 time winner. The profit from the raffle combines with the Race for Education profit to offset tuition costs, provide some tuition aide and fund the numerous technology and facility projects that are beyond the scope of the normal school budget.

"Protectress of the Roman people," you know our needs, and we know that you will provide, so that, as at Cana in Galilee, joy and celebration may return after this time of trial.







Greetings and Happy New Year to all St. Rita parishioners from the Sewing Ministry! In spite of our inability to meet in person this past year, the ladies of the Sewing Ministry were busy sewing at home. In 2020 the Sewing Ministry created 6690 items for our parishioners and other agencies in town. That total includes 4898 face masks, 483 Christmas stockings, 224 clothing protectors (adult bibs), 199 pillowcases, 114 decorative pillows, 81 stuffed toys, 73 winter hats, 67 baby blankets, and 56 Baptismal bibs. These items and more have been distributed to our community and our own parish. We continue to sew at home in the new year, and are hoping to be able to meet again soon. If there are any ladies who are getting bored at home and looking for something to do, we can supply you with fabric and patterns to create useful items, to be delivered to someone who can use them. Please contact the office if you are interested, and they will connect you to us. Stay well!
