“But a Samaritan traveler who came upon him was moved with compassion at the sight.” - Lk 10:33

Excerpts from the Lectionary for Mass ©2001, 1998, 1970 CCD.

In my homily this weekend, I talk about “filling in the cracks”. As the tuck-pointing of the bricks going on at Sacred Heart of Jesus church ensures that the walls will not crumble from the forces of the weather, our humble, behind the scenes acts renew the mortar that keeps the members of our Church and our society from falling apart under the relentless attacks of the devil. The devil knows that if he can separate us from each other, he can work on each of us one-on-one. Alone none of us can counter his powers of destruction.

Without a doubt, the most important of these acts is prayer. Prayer enlists the power of God against the forces of evil. God always wins that battle.

According to Jesus, the most effective prayer is done in the quiet of each ones “inner room” with the door closed (Mt 6:6). For a lot of us, this means getting up early in the morning and having a place and a time for just “me” and God without distractions.

But a very useful thing about prayer is that it is also portable. Wherever our heart is, it can be at prayer. St. Paul said “pray at every opportunity” (Eph 6:18). We see a need in our neighbor and immediately pray for a solution without having to go behind closed doors. Our “inner room” becomes the recesses of our attentive and compassionate heart. The prayer binds us to our neighbor and to God in a triangle. Any builder knows the strength of a triangle.

When I need someone to fill in my own cracks, the first person I go to is my mother. She is the best pray-er I know! She even has letters behind her name to prove it: W.P. (That stands for Widow of Prayer.)

After my Dad died in 2007, Mom joined a lay apostolate called Widows of Prayer. Just a few years ago she made her final solemn vows and consecrated her life to prayer—specifically for the clergy (but I know she’d pray for me even if I weren’t a deacon!) Her prayer, which indeed is in the manner that St. Paul endorses, is a force that has held our large family together for years. I suspect, now that she is praying for the priests, the devil’s influence on them will be frustrated.

Unfortunately, as all who pray experience from time to time, when the devil gets frustrated, he works harder. Mom has been known to call one of us kids at any hour of the day or night to join her in prayer as she feels the devil trying to attack her. Sometimes it takes two or three repetitions of the Prayer to St. Michael to drive him away. Sometimes it even takes anointing by the priest.

In two weeks, I will travel to be with my family and who knows how many others to join Mom in celebrating her 100th birthday. Your prayers for Mom on that occasion and beyond will cement her position as a strong prayer force against the devil for whatever years she has left. You certainly won’t want to miss **this** opportunity to pray for her!

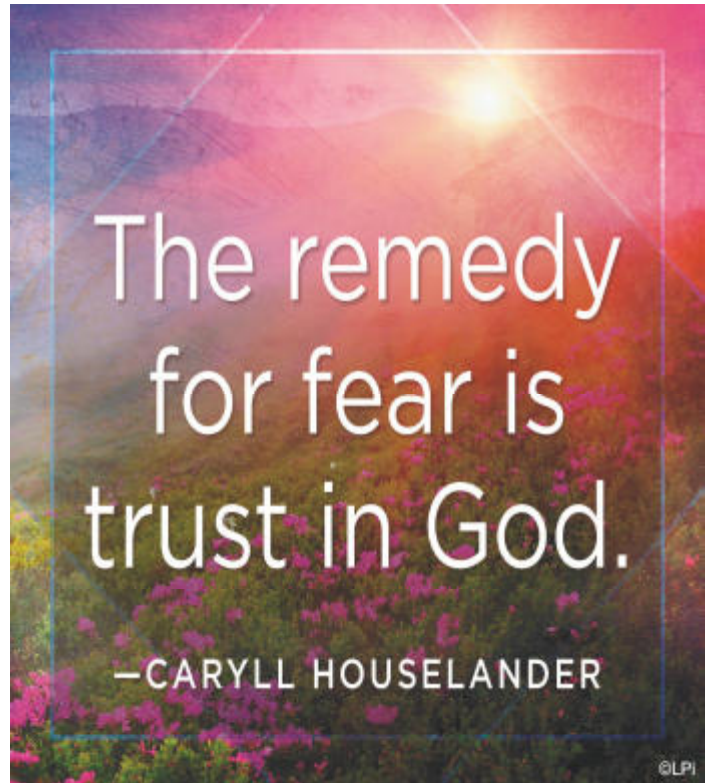

What does it mean to give of yourself completely, without reservation, without fear, and without a concern for the cost? Should it matter if the person who needs us is unlike us in skin color, religion, or nationality? What does real mercy look like?

Jesus answered these questions beautifully in perhaps the greatest of the stewardship parables, the story of the Good Samaritan. Here a Judean traveler has been attacked, beaten, and left for dead on the side of the road. Others see him, but the cost to them to stop and help is too great. It is a Samaritan, one who is despised by most in the area, that stops, and he gives of his time, talent, and treasure to help the poor victim.

Where the Samaritan was going we cannot know for sure, but he stopped to give his time to the beaten man. Using oil and wine, he bandaged the wounds. Not everyone has the knowledge and skills to care for someone in this manner. Here, he gave of his talent. Then he placed the man on his own animal and carried him to an inn the rest of the day. The following day he pays the innkeeper, yet leaves explaining that if the payment is not enough, when he travels back on through he will repay him whatever the cost. Of course, here he shares his treasure.

The sharing of these things is profound enough, but it is the statement of his willingness to pay whatever the balance is that elevates this tale to an ultimate example of stewardship. The Samaritan does not care how high the cost. He will give whatever is needed. This is mature discipleship, to respond to the call of Jesus Christ regardless of the cost. This is true stewardship.

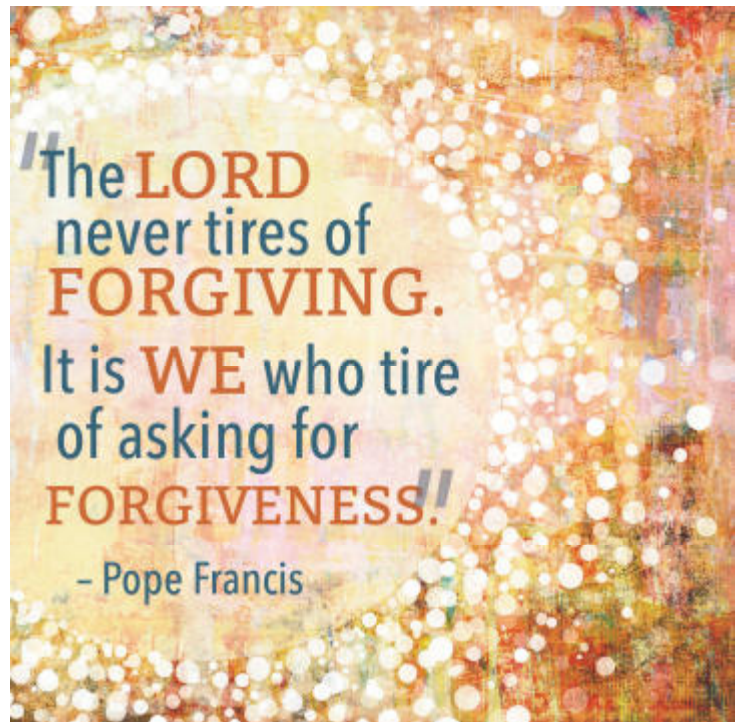
