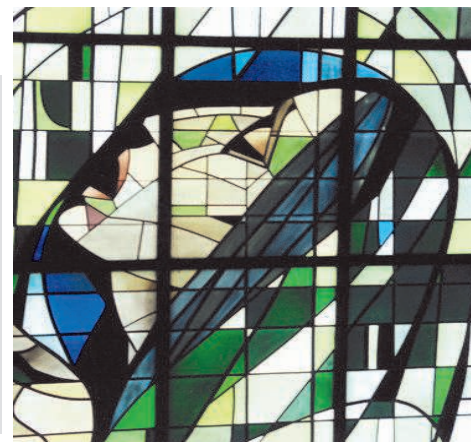

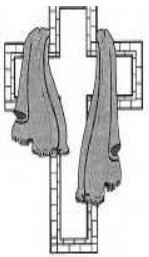

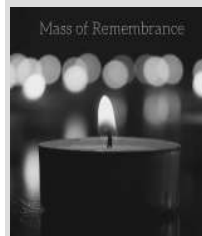


Blessing of Prayer Shawls
