



When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. Live The Liturgy - Inspiration For The Week
 Even the slightest flicker of a light helps to properly orient us when we find ourselves in total darkness. Being in darkness can be unsettling and even a bit unnerving. We lose our focus and struggle to find our bearings and achieve balance. On life's journey we may think we are walking in the light but are really lingering in darkness. We do not see the full picture, either because we are distracted, disinterested, or even apprehensive. Sometimes, we even choose to close our eyes when the light is readily available to illuminate our path. Do we really desire to know the truth of who we are? In Jesus Christ, a light has been given to those who dwell in darkness. God's revelation gives us the light to see where we come from, who we are and where we are going. It also tells us that this Good News is not meant for just a privileged few but is intended to go out to all the world. Is this something we want to see? lpi

Patris Corde - WITH A FATHER'S HEART
 Every manger scene includes three main characters: the Infant Jesus, the Virgin Mary and St. Joseph. Later additions might include angels, shepherds, sheep and Wise Men but the Holy Family is the essence of the Nativity story. However, one of those three characters remains very much in the shadows, Joseph. It is only through the Gospels of Luke and especially Matthew that we catch glimpses of the man who would raise the King of Kings to manhood.

On the 150th Anniversary of the Proclamation of St. Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church by Blessed Pope Pius IX (Dec. 8, 20), Pope Francis encourages all Catholics to renew their dedication to the father who protected, guided and nurtured Jesus. During this pandemic we have been reminded of all those in our society who toil, often in obscurity, for the good of others. How many of those we are calling "essential workers" had previously gone unnoticed and underappreciated. Yet they, like Joseph play a vital role in the building up of society by doing their best. Joseph put himself at the service of salvation.

Through his ancestral line and as spouse of Mary, Joseph becomes a connection between the Old and New Testaments. On the word of an angel in a dream, Joseph protects Mary by accepting her into his home and heart knowing that her pregnancy could have caused scandal. Later, Joseph again protects his family by obeying the command of an angel, "Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him". (Mt 2:13) St. Luke tells us that Joseph ensured that all requirements of the Law were fulfilled in regards to the child Jesus. (Lk 2: 21-24)

Joseph reminds us that in life we will not always understand why events occur as they do. Sometimes we become angry or disappointed when the outcome does not match our expectation. Joseph exemplifies the willingness to allow God's Plan to unfold. It is not resignation but an active acceptance that life comes with both joy and sadness, success and failure. We need to muster the courage to face all of life's struggles with quiet confidence in the power of God. We implore the help of Joseph "to strive for the holiness and the perfection of our particular state of life". (Dogmatic Constitution Lumen Gentium, 42)

Epiphany House Blessing

The feast of the Epiphany (or Twelfth Night) celebrates the coming of the Magi to adore the Christ child. On this day Christians have traditionally blessed their homes using holy water and incense.

They marked the exterior (and sometimes interior) doorways with chalk that remained until the following year. They prayed that peace, love and mutual respect would abide in the hearts of all who resided here.

For our new year, all parish families are invited to mark with chalk the lintel of the main door of your home with the symbol 20+C+M+B+21. It stands for the current year and the names of the three wise men. It also stands for the Latin phrase *Christus mansionem benedicat* (*May Christ Bless This Home*). As a family, walk through the rooms of the house with a candle singing carols such as We Three Kings and The Twelve Days of Christmas. Conclude the blessing with a feast.

NATIVITY OF THE LORD

In 2010, a priest of the Milwaukee Archdiocese heard the story of a 4 year old little girl who was very concerned that Baby Jesus never had any socks on in pictures. Fr. Roscioli, spiritual director of MACCW (Milw. Archdiocesan Council of Catholic Women) mentioned this to the women and this was the beginning of their "Socks for Baby Jesus" annual sock collection.

The Nativity of the Lord Christian Ladies Guild has been collecting socks annually in January since 2013. In past years the NL "Socks for Baby Jesus" benefitted Project Concern. But because clients have been unable to shop at PC most of this year due to the pandemic, they have an abundance of socks. But there are still many feet that need warm coverings! **This year our collection of new socks will be donated to Hope House**, a temporary shelter for primarily homeless families. Men's socks collected will be donated to MVHI (Milwaukee Homeless Veterans Initiative), an agency run by veterans in cooperation with the Veteran's Administration that provides help to homeless and at-risk veterans.

We invite you to donate NEW socks - any size, color, shape - for men, women, children, toddlers and infants for our 2021 sock drive.
