

Pope Francis has proclaimed that a Year of St Joseph will commence from Dec 8, 2020 to Dec 8, 2021, in honor of the 150th anniversary of St Joseph being selected patron of the universal Church. In his apostolic letter, *Patris Corde* ("With a Father's Heart") Pope Francis shared some personal points on the spouse of Mary:

"Each of us can discover in Joseph—the man who goes unnoticed—a daily discreet and hidden presence; an intercessor, support and guide in times of trouble." The Holy Father desires to honor St Joseph "increased during...pandemic, when we experienced, amid the crisis, how our lives are woven together and sustained by ordinary people, people often overlooked. St Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation."

The Apostolic Penitentiary announced it will offer a plenary indulgence to the faithful who recite any approved prayer to honor St Joseph. Our parish community will recite the Litany to St Joseph every week at the Wednesday morning Mass. The litany is one of only six approved by the Church for public recitation.

US Catholic Bishops and the Covid19 Vaccines

On December 14, Bishop Kevin Rhoades and Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann issued a statement addressing the moral concerns raised by the recently released vaccines to fight the Covid19 epidemic. The vaccines by Moderna, Pfizer and AstraZeneca have some connection to cell lines that originated with the tissue from aborted fetuses. In their statement, the Bishops acknowledge the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines have a more remote connection to these morally compromised cell lines and that taking the vaccines can be seen as "an act of charity toward the other members of our community. In this way, being vaccinated safely against Covid-19 should be considered an act of love of our neighbor and part of our moral responsibility for the common good." The AstraZeneca vaccine is "more morally compromised" and should be avoided but if that is impossible, "it would be acceptable to receive this vaccine". Catholics are exhorted not to become desensitized to the evil of abortion or the use of aborted fetal cells in scientific research. Fun Facts for Faithful Kids

- "Go, sell all you have and give the money to the poor". St. Anthony of Egypt read this quote in Mark's gospel and took it to heart. He had a large fortune but gave it all away to the poor and lived his life in a cave as a hermit. His holiness attracted people who came for healing and spiritual advice. His feast is **January 17**.
- A martyr is a person who gives up his or her life, rather than gives up the faith in God. In 1215, St. Berard and his friends preached in Morocco and were the first Franciscan missionaries killed for preaching about Jesus. Could you become a martyr? Would you give your life for Jesus?
- January 18 is the holiday honoring Dr. Martin Luther King. After the American Civil War, laws were passed that were unfair to African Americans. They could not go to school with whites, shop at the same stores, or sit on any seat in a public bus. There were separate water fountains and bathrooms for black people and white people. Dr. King worked with many others to bring equality to America.

"Socks for Baby Jesus" annual sock collection
