

As we look at our lives and world events, do we ever find ourselves wondering if God is sleeping? After all, maybe God's patient, unconditional love has run its course and He is finally fed up with humanity's reluctance to accept the truth about who we are. God really can't be that patient! All throughout human history, many have prayed to God for intervention or for particular needs. Because their prayers were not answered in the way they wanted or anticipated, they felt that God may have abandoned them. Were they right? It seems that we are continuing, at a rapid rate, down a path of destruction. Do you not care, God, that we may be perishing? When the boats of our lives are rocking and the seas tumultuous, we want to know that we have God's attention. Even more so, we want God's intervention.

Maybe the storms and the waves are necessary. If we listen, they can teach us valuable lessons. Without them, we would never learn that we have the strength to endure, understand the uselessness of fear and worry, or develop the ability to really trust. If God immediately rushed in and simply calmed things down before they got difficult, what good would that really be? We would miss opportunities to learn how to drink more deeply of life, treasure its complexity, irony, and beauty and fully engage ourselves in surrendering to the love of our Creator. It is easy to walk on the surface of life without immersing ourselves in its messiness. Life has to burn its way through us in order to bring us to a place of secure trust. It's unfortunate that some prefer a shallower journey.

That's the balancing act that comes with faith. It is not God's job to prevent us from encountering the torrential rains and winds of life. Many believe that if faith is done the right way, that God will provide for smooth sailing. That's not how it works. God permits us to ride out the difficult stuff knowing that the storm will eventually be calmed. Do we not have faith that God will do this? True faith trusts in the steadfastness of God's love when the seas are calm and when they are choppy. God's unconditional loving presence shines through all of it and endures forever. Knowing this allows us to put our boats out into uncharted waters without hesitation. For the foster dads that are called to gather and cover the fragile ones.


For the Sunday dads who care for our children and lead them in faith.

Church Collections

Question: Where does the money go that is collected each week at Church?

Answer: This is a good question! Every parish has financial obligations, including the basic operation of the buildings, salaries, maintenance, and improvements. In addition, there are schools to support, programs to run, charities to be funded, and operational expenses like hosts and wine for Mass, music books, vestments, and so on. In some cases, cemeteries and other buildings need attention. Finally, there is the diocesan assessment that each parish pays to help run the diocese and the support services provided to each parish.

Most parishes manage to get by with the collection, a few fundraisers and endowments. But contrary to popular opinion, cash flow is also a problem, and many parishes operate in the red. The Finance Committee is responsible for assisting the pastor in fiscal management, and good stewardship is the basis for successful programs.

Catholics on Vacation

No matter where we roam, a Catholic can always find a church in which to feel at home. Each state has a variety of shrines, miraculous sites and incredible statues.

This week we explore Idaho. The resource is Monuments, Marvels, and Miracles A Traveler's Guide to Catholic America by Marion Amberg.

Sharing the saint with the Milwaukee Archdiocese cathedral, the Boise Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist is a visitors delight. Due to finances during the construction many of the "stained-glass" windows are actually colored glass with painted faces and bodies, the "painted ceiling" is really a painted canvas, and there are no towers.

Boise also has the largest number of Basques outside of Spain. (boisecathedral.org) Another unique church awaits at the Mission of the Sacred Heart for the Coeur d'Alene Indians near Cataldo in northern Idaho. Fr. Antonio Ravalli designed the church with chandeliers made out of tin cans, huckleberry juice was used to stain the ceiling panels and newspaper to act as wallpaper.
