CoVID Measures in Place

- Masks are optional at all Masses. We recommend that people follow the CDC's updated guidelines, which state that those who are fully vaccinated "no longer need to wear a mask or physically distance in any setting, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance." There is enough space for people to move around if they are not comfortable with masked/unmasked people around them.
- We are going to keep social distancing measures by still using every other pew (we really do not need all the pews to assume our normal Mass attendance) and by still having the ministers distribute communion in the pews.
- We will keep a basket at the back of the church for the collection.
- In addition to the weekly Friday cleaning, we will clean and disinfect the church between the 8 AM and 10 AM Masses on Sunday.
- We will continue live-streaming all our Weekday Masses and the 10 AM on Sunday on Facebook Live, YouTube and on our website.

Re-launching the Love One Another Capital Campaign

One of the projects the pandemic brought to a halt was the initial phase of the Archdiocesan Capital Campaign. We had started the “quiet” phase of the campaign, only that just by meeting with a limited number of parishioners, we were already at 70% of the goal that had been set for us. We are going to resume the campaign, and we hope we can continue the amazing success we were having. Some information about the campaign:

- The Love One Another campaign is for the next five years
- Sacred Heart was chosen to be a pilot parish—we are leading the way
- Our goal is \$700,000—roughly 1.4 times our ordinary annual collection
- Parishes will keep 60% of the pledges, 40% will go to Archdiocesan efforts: helping the poor, Catholic Education, the Seminary, etc.
- If we surpass the goal, more of the surplus funds stay at the parish

Our “parish case” has been slightly modified from the one we had in January 2020. The pandemic forced us to do some investment that we thought we would do through the campaign (like the live-stream capabilities) and needs like fixing our facilities have become very obvious since then (like rebuilding the parking lot). We have reduced some of the other items in the parish case so we can start reserving money for major repairs that will certainly come our way in the next few years.
