CoVID Measures in Place

- On September 4, 2021, the Racine City Council [approved an ordinance](#) that requires face coverings for all people in public indoor spaces in the City of Racine, regardless of vaccination status. In accordance with the mandate, masks will be required at all Masses, unless a medical condition prevents a person from using one. We will continue to follow local guidance, and we thank you for your patience and cooperation.
 - Social distancing measures will continue by using every other pew (we really do not need all the pews to assume our normal Mass attendance) and by still having the ministers distribute communion in the pews.
 - We will keep a basket at the back of the church for the collection.
 - In addition to the weekly Friday cleaning, the church is cleaned and disinfected between the 8:00 AM and 10:00 AM Masses on Sunday.

The Lectionary and Cycles of Readings

An expression often used is: “The Lectionary today offers us...” or something along those lines. The Lectionary is the book that contains the Scripture readings that are proclaimed on a specific day. The root of Lectionary is the Latin *lectio*, and in English, lesson.

The start of a new liturgical year, beginning with the first Sunday of Advent, also marks the transition from one lectionary cycle (A, B, or C) to the next. These cycles are a result of the Second Vatican Council, which ordered a change in the Sunday readings at Mass so that Catholics would become more familiar with the text of the Bible. As a result we now have a three-year cycle of readings on Sunday built around the three synoptic Gospels—Matthew (year A), Mark (year B, the one we are on now) and Luke (year C).

As experienced this year, because it is shorter, large sections of the gospel of John are read during year B. For weekdays in Ordinary Time, the Lectionary rotates the first reading and the psalm in a two-year cycle, with the gospel text being the same for both years.
