Mass Intentions 2022

The Mass Intention Book is now open for the year 2022. Here is a brief explanation as to what is a Mass. An individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass for several reasons (intentions). Most commonly, the intention is for the repose of the soul of someone who has died, but it could also be for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday). The tradition of offering Masses for others, particularly the dead, originates in the very early Church. When a priest offers Holy Mass, he has three intentions: First, to offer the Mass reverently and validly in accord with the norms of the Church; second, to offer the Mass in union with the whole Church and for the good of the whole Church; and, third, to offer the Mass for a particular intention, what we usually call the "Mass Intention." While the Church warns about any semblance that a Mass is being bought, there is a small stipend attached to the intention. At some point in history, but still being the case in many places in the world, the stipend was there to support the needs of the priest and of the church. The stipend in the Archdiocese is \$10.

Please call or email the parish office, or place your Mass request in an envelope marked "Parish Office," and drop it in the collection basket. We ask that you include your phone number. Be mindful that we try to balance weekend and weekday Masses, as weekend Masses are most in demand. By Canon Law, one of the weekend Masses has the intention set for the Living and Deceased Members of Sacred Heart (the *pro-populo* Mass). Therefore, we limit initial requests to selecting only two weekend Masses and five weekday Masses per person making the request. Once there has been a reasonable opportunity for everyone, if there are Masses without an intention, it will be announced in the bulletin.

Book of Remembrance

The book, in which the names of any deceased, can be written, will be in the vestibule of church beginning this weekend.

Please write the names of deceased family members and friends whom you would like remembered at Masses during the month of November. This book will be placed at the altar during November, following All Souls Day.

Mass on Tuesdays to Move to 6 PM Beginning on All Souls

Before the pandemic, our most attended weekday Mass was Tuesday evening. Beginning with the celebration of All Souls, November 2, Mass on Tuesday will be at 6:00 PM. We will continue live-streaming this Mass.

At the Mass for All Souls, we remember All the Faithful Departed; and at Sacred Heart, we have a special ritual to commemorate those parishioners who have died during the year.

CoVID Measures in Place

- On September 4, 2021, the Racine City Council approved an ordinance that requires face coverings for all people in public indoor spaces in the City of Racine, regardless of vaccination status. We will continue to follow local guidance, and we thank you for your patience and cooperation.

Catholic Cemetery Association of Racine *Green Burial Option*

In recognition of a growing interest in "Green Burials," the Catholic Cemetery Association of Racine has opened an area for Green Burials, called St. Francis Meadow, located in the southwest portion of Holy Cross Cemetery in Caledonia. The purpose of a Green Burial is to allow the body to quickly and naturally return to the elements of the earth and begin the regeneration of new life. In St. Francis Meadow, the fundamental principles of Green Burial will apply:

No embalming with formaldehyde or other unsafe chemicals. No concrete or metal burial vault. Only a biodegradable casket, shroud, or other container. A more natural landscaping, using prairie grasses and wildflowers.
