Capital Campaign Update

We have reached 111.4% of our goal. Any pledges we receive now will be 80% for the parish and 20% for the Archdiocese. Our "stretch goal" is now \$875,000. All pledges received after that would stay 100% at Sacred Heart.

As you know, our parish case consists of starting a fund for major repairs, upgrading the church itself, remodeling the basement for a Faith Formation space, and creating an endowment-type fund for those most in need. Any pledge, big or small, helps. **We want to know your opinion, so during the Fellowship after Mass on our Parish Anniversary Weekend we will facilitate a brainstorm process on how to upgrade our church space.**

Did you Know? Why Some Holy Days of Obligation Are Not Celebrated as a Holy Day

You may have wondered what happens with the Holy Days of Obligation that seem to be different from one year to another. For dioceses in the United States, there are five days of obligation beyond any Sunday of the year:

- Mary the Mother of God (January 1),
- Assumption of Mary (August 15),
- All Saints Day (November 1),
- Immaculate Conception (December 8)
- Christmas (December 25).

While the Immaculate Conception and Christmas are always Holy Days of Obligation, when any of the three first feasts (Mary Mother of God, the Assumption, or All Saints) fall on a Saturday or a Monday, the solemnity is still celebrated but the obligation is removed—in consideration for the proximity to Sunday. This is what happens this year with All Saints, on November 1. We should still come to Mass for such a beautiful celebration but the obligation is not there this year.

Mass Intentions 2022

The Mass Intention Book is open for the year 2022. Please call or email the parish office, or place your Mass request in an envelope marked "Parish Office," and drop it in the collection basket. We ask that you include your phone number.

We try to balance weekend and weekday Masses, as weekend Masses are most in demand. By Canon Law, one of the weekend Masses has the intention set for the Living and Deceased Members of Sacred Heart (the *pro-populo* Mass). Therefore, we limit initial requests to selecting only two weekend Masses and five weekday Masses per person making the request. Once there has been a reasonable opportunity for everyone, if there are Masses without an intention, it will be announced in the bulletin. The stipend in the Archdiocese is \$10.

CoVID Measures in Place

- As you may know, the Racine City Council recently approved an ordinance to once again require face coverings for all people in public indoor spaces in the City of Racine, regardless of vaccination status. The ordinance went into effect on September 4. In accordance with the mandate, masks will be required at all Masses, unless a medical condition prevents a person from using one. We will continue to follow local guidance, and we thank you for your patience and cooperation.
- We are going to keep social distancing measures by still using every other pew (we really do not need all the pews to assume our normal Mass attendance) and by still having the ministers distribute communion in the pews.
- We will keep a basket at the back of the church for the collection.
- In addition to the weekly Friday cleaning, we will clean and disinfect the church between the 8:00 AM and 10:00 AM Masses on Sunday.
- We will continue live-streaming all our Weekday Masses and the 10:00 AM on Sunday on Facebook Live, YouTube and on our website.

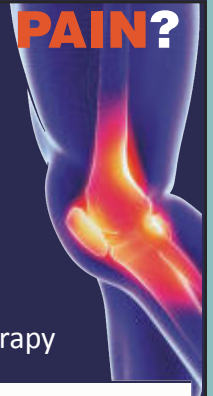
