St. Vincent De Paul Food Pantry

Our Thanksgiving Food collection provided 570.75 lbs. of non-perishable food items. A sincere thank you for your continued support of the pantry, the food items, monetary contributions, and the volunteer hours for those who come in each week and those who come in once a month. Without this support, the pantry would not be able to serve our clients.

In this past fiscal year (October 2020—September 2021), Sacred Heart provided a total of 4,145 lbs. of non-perishable food items; the highest total of the nine parishes that contribute.

Marian Center of Racine

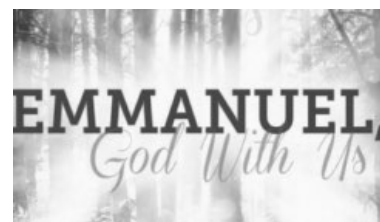
A Christmas special, running to January 15, is being offered to the Catholic Parishes of Racine by Patrick and Patricia Shay of the Marian Center.

CoVID Measures in Place

- We are under the latest ordinance of the Racine City Council which requires face coverings for all people in public indoor spaces in the City of Racine, regardless of vaccination status. The ordinance went into effect on September 4. In accordance with the mandate, masks will be required at all Masses, unless a medical condition prevents a person from using one. We will continue to follow local guidance, and we thank you for your patience and cooperation.
 - We are keeping social distancing measures by still using every other pew (we really do not need all the pews to assume our normal Mass attendance) and by still having the ministers distribute communion in the pews.
 - We are keeping a basket at the back of the church for the collection.
 - In addition to the weekly Friday cleaning, we clean and disinfect the church between the 8:00 AM and 10:00AM Masses on Sunday.
 - We continue live-streaming all our Weekday Masses and the 10:00 AM on Sunday on Facebook Live, YouTube and on our website.
