

Faithful Departed

Ouestion:

How can we pray for the dead throughout the year?

We commemorate the faithful departed on November 2 each year. However, we can and should continue to pray for the dead. Our growth in Christian perfection takes a long time. At the time of our death, many of us might not be saints yet. But God, in His mercy, allows for those who love Him to experience purification after death. Our word for that state is Purgatory. It's the antechamber of heaven, so to speak. We know we're getting in the house, but we're not quite ready to go all the way in. There's rain to shake off our coats and dirt that's clogging our shoes.

Here on earth, we can pray for the souls in Purgatory. One way is to request that your parish offer a Mass for the intention of a specific loved one. We can also remember the departed in our daily prayers. Just as we have special intentions for family and friends here on earth, we can pray for those who have died. It's also a good act of Christian charity to pray for the forgotten, those who have no one else to pray for them. God knows who they are!

CoVID Measures in Place

- We are under the latest ordinance of the Racine City Council, which requires face coverings for all people in public indoor spaces in the City of Racine, regardless of vaccination status. The ordinance went into effect on September 4. In accordance with the mandate, masks will be required at all Masses, unless a medical condition prevents a person from using one. We will continue to follow local guidance, and we thank you for your patience and cooperation.
- We are keeping social distancing measures at all Masses, blocking every other pew.
- Communion is being distributed by using Communion lines (used prior to Covid).
- A basket is at the back of the church for the collection.
- In addition to the weekly Friday cleaning, we clean and disinfect the church between the 8:00 am and 10:00 am Masses on Sunday.
- We continue to live-streaming all our Weekday Masses and the 10:00 am on Sunday on Facebook Live, YouTube, and on our website
