St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry

Food collection weekend is February 12-13. Needed items are: Saltine crackers, pasta sides, tuna fish, bagged potatoes serving less than twenty, condensed Campbell's chicken noodle soup, large peanut butter, pancake syrup.

December: The pantry was open 14 days, and served 105 clients, feeding 342 people including 117 children One hundred ninety-one bags of non-perishable items weighing 2,839 lbs. were given to the families. Also gave out frozen were turkeys (13 + lbs.) and frozen hams weighing 9+ lbs.

A note: Beginning on January 4, 2022 the St. Vincent de Paul meal program moved to the North Pointe Methodist Church across from Piggly Wiggly on Erie Street -- every Tuesday from 4:30 - 5:30 pm.

Dropped Host

Question: What happens to a consecrated host if it accidentally dropped and falls to the ground?

Answer: This a very practical question because, as we all know, accidents happen, even during the most careful celebration of the liturgy. The short answer to this question is that nothing happens to the consecrated host. The Real Presence of Jesus remains in the consecrated host or any consecrated wine that might accidentally be spilled.

Another question we might ask: How should the minsters respond if the Eucharist is dropped or spilled? If this happens, the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of holy Communion should immediately pick up the dropped host and consume it. If it is a case of the Precious Blood being spilled, the minister would use the purificators (and additional purificators if needed) to clean the spill and then the area should be reverently washed as soon as the Mass is over and the water poured into the sacrarium (a special sink that is located in church sacristies for reverently disposing of holy water, the water used to clean sacred vessels, etc.).

CoVID Measures in Place

- We are under the latest <u>ordinance</u> of the Racine City Council, which requires face coverings for all people in public indoor spaces in the City of Racine, regardless of vaccination status. The ordinance went into effect on September 4. In accordance with the mandate, masks will be required at all Masses, unless a medical condition prevents a person from using one. We will continue to follow local guidance, and we thank you for your patience and cooperation.
- We are keeping social distancing measures at all Masses, blocking every other pew.
- Communion is being distributed by using Communion lines (used prior to Covid).
- A basket is at the back of the church for the collection.
- In addition to the weekly Friday cleaning, we clean and disinfect the church between the 8:00 am and 10:00 am Masses on Sunday.
- We continue to live-streaming all our Weekday Masses and the 10:00 am on Sunday on Facebook Live, YouTube, and on our website
