Ash Wednesday

The distribution of ashes will be different this year due to the pandemic. Instead of a cross being put on foreheads, ashes will be sprinkled on top of our heads. Fr. Mike will bless the ashes and then do the prayer with the ashes over everyone. All will then come forward to receive ashes. Although not commonly done in the U.S., this practice is common in other parts of the world. A little background:

The ritual use of ashes began in Old Testament times signifying mourning, mortality and penance. The ritual for the "Day of Ashes" is found in the earliest editions of the Gregorian Sacramentary which dates at least to the 8th century. About the year 1000, an Anglo-Saxon priest named Aelfric preached, "We read in the books both in the Old Law and in the New that the men who repented of their sins bestrewed themselves with ashes and clothed their bodies with sackcloth. Now let us do this little (act) at the beginning of our Lent that we strew ashes upon our heads to signify that we ought to repent of our sins during the Lenten fast."

So, even though this ritual will be different than what we are used to, it returns us to an ancient practice of our church which has endured for centuries.

MARIANNE'S LECTIO

"PRAISE THE LORD,
WHO HEALS THE BROKENHEARTED."

Dear friends, this Psalm spoke to me because of the two-fold bunch it holds. First, we are to praise the Lord; that must be our response in all things! We have confidence to praise Him because we know Who He is, and that is the second entity: He heals the brokenhearted. I want to invite you to some practical applications that can connect us to the Readings proclaimed today.

Our days are filled with so much that we can forget that God is with us through it all. He permitted you to make the green light that allowed you to get to work on time. He allowed the snow to fall so heavy that our work/school day was changed—even if not to your liking. God required the amount of snow that allowed you to shovel—maybe getting exercise for the first time in a while. God allowed the sun and moon to shine giving us opportunities to look up, and hopefully think of Him. All of these moments should bring us to praise God! I have set an alarm every hour that I am awake to go off and thereby remind me to pause for just a moment and recall that God is here with me. I need this reminder to continue to allow God to be first and for me to die to my own desires and wants for the day. **What is it that you can do to help you remember to praise God in all things!** It has been beautifully rewarding to be renewed in the perspective and be sustained in Who God is for me!

He heals! This is what I am convicted to spend my life proclaiming of our God; that He desires to heal us! **What do you need healing from today?** What in your life has caused there to be slavery which seems to have you speak like Job [though we do not hear Job speak praise in these verses offered to us today, Job never rejected God through all His suffering—a great example for us!] Do we proclaim like Paul from the Corinthians that we will never quit of speaking about Christ despite possible persecution because we know His Goodness? Here we find such freedom, an acceptance to experience hardship for Love because of the confidence [faith] that I am not alone! I find this joy through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, daily Eucharist, and personal prayer. **Ask the Lord how He is giving you the ability to respond to His pursuit of healing; and then not only act, but receive that gift!**

Our Gospel witnesses the blend of how Jesus praised and healed. He knew who He was as the Son of God, and so spent time in communion with the One, THE ONLY ONE, who could give Him strength! Brothers and sisters, **we MUST spend time with THE ONLY ONE WHO CAN SAVE, Jesus Christ!** He will give us the perspective we need when we feel like Job, He will sustain us to fight like Paul for what is right, and He will continue to provide grace upon Grace as He did with Jesus to perform miracles in His Name! Let us live like Jesus and BELIEVE that He is worthy of all praise, not only because of the miracles we witness, but because He demonstrates for us how to speak to the Father—with raw, vulnerable trust.

FEBRUARY 8—World Day of Prayer, Reflection, and Action against Human Trafficking & The Feast Day of St. Josephine Bakhita

Born in the Darfur region of Sudan in 1869, St. Bakhita was kidnapped and enslaved as a child. Eventually she was sold to an Italian diplomat and taken to Italy, where she valiantly asserted her freedom with the help of the Cannossian Sisters of Venice. Through her faith, St. Bakhita realized the promise of liberty inherent in the human spirit. She lived out the rest of her life as a Cannossian sister, sharing her empowering testimony of human freedom and dignity.

In October 2000, Josephine Bakhita was canonized by Pope John Paul II, at which point he noted that “in St. Josephine Bakhita we find a shining advocate of genuine emancipation. The history of her life inspires not passive acceptance but the firm resolve to work effectively to free girls and women from oppression and violence, and to return them to their dignity in the full exercise of their rights” (St. Bakhita’s Canonization Mass, October 1, 2000).
