

#### **GO MAKE DISCIPLES Penitential Fridays: Suggestions**

As part of the Go Make Disciples initiative, the diocese is asking us to commit to minimally one act of penance on Fridays, no matter how small, in memory of Christ's passion. Instead, each of us should examine our lives for an area of spiritual discipline that could be improved. Others may abstain from unnecessary technology and use that time for prayer and reflection. The diocese reminds us that even "a small sacrifice offered up with great love is worth more in God's eyes than a larger sacrifice offered with less love."






#### Knights of Columbus Scholarships

# 2022 Spiritual Adoption Signup January 22 and 23



### What is Spiritual Adoption?

Spiritual Adoption is a program which seeks to bring about a Culture of Life through prayer, education and practical help. It began in the 1970's with Archbishop Fulton Sheen's pledge to pray daily for nine months for an unknown, unborn baby who may be in danger of abortion.

Here at OLA we begin our prayer for the protection of the unborn and for the child's mother and father in January to commemorate the anniversary of the Supreme Court decisions which legalized abortion through all nine months of pregnancy. Parishioners

are asked to fill out a pledge card with their name and you may choose to name the baby. The parishioners keep the prayer card with the prayer to be said. Then we follow the growth and development of are Spiritually Adopted babies through colorful posters showing the humanity of the child. These posters change monthly until our babies are due to be born in October with the posters hanging on the Spiritual Adoption board in the Gathering Space. There are also monthly updates on our baby's development in the bulletin.

To honor are Spiritually Adopted babies and to provide practical help for mothers and fathers in need we host a Baby Bottle Campaign throughout October with the proceeds going to our local pregnancy clinic.

As we pray for our baby it is important to also pray for the baby's mother and father, and that their mother makes healthy choices for herself and for her baby. We pray also that these babies are brought up in loving homes and that each may know that they are a beloved child of God.

### **Immigrant Relief Fund**

Follow up on woman whom we helped financially to file papers with Immigration: Since filing, she now waits one or two months to receive her "green card" for being a permanent resident. As a permanent resident, she will receive a social security number, permission to work in the U.S., permission to travel outside the U.S., and will be able to apply for a driver's license. She will have this status for three years before she can apply for citizenship. (Go to https://www.USCIS.gov website for more information) The donation from our fund was used to file papers with Immigration which is just one small part of the cost she will be encountering as she pursues becoming a U.S. citizen.

#### In brief, what is needed:

Gift cards of any denomination fromWalgreen's, Aldi's, Walmart, Menard's, Woodman's or Mobile gas cards Monetary donations for medical, general household needs and clothing.

People flee their country of origin for a variety of reasons. In the 1800s, my ancestors came here for a better life just like many people who come today but securing the proper documents for entering the U.S. is far more complicated than it was in the 1800s. So, if they arrive here without the proper documents, they face many additional challenges – employment being the greatest. They often lose employment once an employer realizes they are undocumented. Sometimes their teenage or young adult children work to provide for the family.
