



## January 30, 2022 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time





St. Paul tells us in the Second Reading today — the "measure" is the love that we put into each of these aspects of our lives. "If I have all faith so as to move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away everything I own and hand my body over so that I may boast but do not have love, I gain nothing." God is not after a particular number. What He wants us to give over to Him is our very selves.

Real love is not a sentiment. Real love is manifested in living a virtuous life. We read later in St. Paul's letter that real love takes strength: it is patient, kind, humble, othercentered, truth-seeking, and long-suffering. Love is the heroic giving of oneself even when it is uncomfortable; especially then. Love looks like Jesus. It lives like Jesus. Sometimes, living like Jesus is difficult. We see this in the Gospel Reading today where we find Jesus in action, preaching in the synagogue in His hometown. He speaks truth to the people He loves, the ones He grew up with and shared His early days with. How do they respond? They are filled with fury and run Him out of town, intent on throwing Him from a cliff! Yet Jesus is undeterred. He passes right through them and presses forward with the mission His Father has entrusted to Him.

We are called to live with this same strength and determination, fueled by the power of love and by gratitude for all God has given us.

## What proof do we have for the inspiration of the Bible?

The Bible itself claims to be inspired by God (2 Timothy 3:16-17), but is there evidence to support this claim? Do we have proof of the inspiration of the Bible? Several lines of evidence exist to reveal how God has divinely inspired Scripture.

First, fulfilled prophecy offers evidence to support God's inspiration of Scripture. Specific fulfillments in the life of Jesus were used by the early church to prove to Jews that Jesus was the Christ. Regarding Jesus, the Bible predicted hundreds of years in advance that, among other things, He would be born of a virgin (Isaiah 7:14), would be born in Bethlehem (Micah 5:2), would be introduced by a messenger (John the Baptist, Isaiah 40:3), would be rejected by the Jews (Isaiah 53:3), would be pierced in His side (Zechariah 12:10; John 19:34), and would suffer crucifixion (Psalm 22:16-18; John 19:23-24). Each of these prophecies was fulfilled exactly yet was predicted hundreds of years in advance.

Second, the unity of the Bible is a proof of its inspiration. It was written by about 40 authors over an approximately 1,500-year period in three languages on three continents. Its authors ranged from kings to shepherds and scholars to fishermen yet offer a consistent theme regarding key teachings. Amazingly, there is not one clear contradiction in the Bible, an impossible achievement for a book so diverse apart from God's inspiration.

Third, many historical and archaeological findings support the accuracy and reliability of Scripture, offering additional proof of the inspiration of the Bible. From the kings of Israel to the kingdoms of Babylon and Persia, the Bible speaks accurately on history at all points.

Fourth, the Bible speaks accurately regarding many areas of science long before the discoveries were made. The shape of the earth (<u>Isaiah 40:22</u>), valleys in the seas (<u>2 Samuel 22:16</u>), and the hydrological cycle (<u>Job 26:8</u>), for example, all express ideas not discovered until long after being mentioned in Scripture.

These and other examples help to show the Bible is no ordinary book. In fact, it is the only book in human history to include such a wide variety of information that is completely accurate and yet speaks even of future events in detail without conflict or error. Such accuracy helps provide evidence of the divine nature of the Bible.
