Today we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord.

Living long before the internet and social media, the Magi from the East relied upon a single star as a sign that a king had been born.

So today we celebrate the revelation of the birth of our Lord to the outside world, to us.

The light over the little town of Bethlehem has revealed the light of the world to the ends of the earth.

The great thing about the Magi was their faith. Even though they were outsiders – Gentiles – they recognized Christ as the Savior of the world.

The Magi can serve as models of faith for us on our journey. They were single-minded. They refused to be put off by difficulties and hardships.

When they found Christ they offered him gold, frankincense and myrrh. This shows what happens to those who find Christ. Their hearts are awakened and burst into life.

When we find Christ and offer our lives to him, he will help us to open up to the treasures of goodness that lie buried inside us, so that we can offer “gifts” to our sisters and brothers, especially those who are poor as Christ was.

I am always fascinated by the line in the Gospel that the Magi returned home “by another route.” This suggests more than just a geographical route. I believe it suggests a new attitude, a new disposition.

Having met Christ and heard the Gospels, we too travel through life by a different route. We will have different attitudes, different values and different goals.

It is impossible to encounter Christ without it impacting the way we live each day.

"This should be a good opportunity to explore our spirituality and faith," said Fr. Brian.


It will be open to all men in the parish and would also be appropriate for teenage sons.

Wise men see God in the simple things

If you're on social media, you have probably seen a meme going around that features this quote: "God has a plan for your life. The enemy has a plan for your life. Be ready for both. Just be wise enough to know which one to battle and which one to embrace."

There were certainly two competing plans for the Magi: God's and Herod's.

And, wise as they supposedly were, it wasn't entirely easy for the Magi to discern which was which.

After all, Herod posed as a friend. He offered the Magi hospitality and kindness.

Though the Gospel doesn't say so, he probably flattered them and appealed to every moral weakness he could observe in them.

In his palace, they must have felt great physical comfort — rest and tables of plenty on what was an otherwise long and treacherous journey.

But if the Magi were honest with themselves, I will bet they would have admitted that, regardless of Herod's charm, they felt a gnawing sense of doubt while in his presence.

When they looked upon the Christ Child, born in a stable without any of the comforts of the world or protections of wealth, they probably felt the opposite. They probably felt safe.

The Magi were lucky enough to have the right plan spelled out for them in a dream, but for the rest of us, it's enough to remember this: God's plan is often the one that leads us to places of great simplicity, great humility and great love.

Let's have the wisdom to view power with suspicion, and innocence with admiration.— Tracy Earl Welliver, LPI





- If cremation is to be chosen, it should happen after the funeral Mass, if at all possible.
- Cremated remains should be treated with the same respect shown to the bodies of our deceased loved ones, and should be interred in a Catholic cemetery, not kept in a private residence, scattered, or made into jewelry.
- Your Catholic cemetery has many options. Pre-planning allows you to learn about all the options and make an informed decision. If you don't pre-plan, someone else will make those decisions for you.
- Remember to let your family know your wishes! When your time comes, they will appreciate knowing what you wanted.
- Call the office at **Resurrection Cemetery** at 608-238-5561 to make an appointment with one of our expert Family Service Councilors.


