

Dear Friends: I hope you have had a week of true Easter Joy! Alleluia!

As you have heard over the past few months, we have embarked on a project to construct a gathering space, or narthex, on the east side of the church, as well as renovation of existing facilities, namely the parish hall, kitchen and restrooms.

This is an exciting venture.

We have worked with Architectural Design Consultants, Inc., (ADCI) to develop plans. ADCI has done extensive work on projects within the Diocese of Madison.

I have reviewed their work at other parishes and am very excited about the plans they have designed.

We have presented these plans by webinar and in the parish newsletter.

The staff, Parish Council, Finance Council and a small focus group have looked things over and all came away favoring the work done by ADCI.

The Diocese of Madison has also reviewed the initial plans and gave us the go-ahead to proceed with fundraising.

So, here are a couple of immediate items:

First, due to COVID it has been difficult to have an onsite presentation of the plans.

So, beginning this weekend and continuing into the future the architectural renderings will be available for viewing after all the Masses. I will also be available to answer questions.

I will also make myself available during the week if you would like to look things over.

Simply call me at the office and we can set up a mutually agreeable time.

Second, we are beginning a capital campaign to make this project a reality.

**“Celebrating our Past – Building for our Future” is the campaign theme.**

The goal of this campaign is \$3.2 million. To date, we have raised a third of this amount through unsolicited donations.

We have hired CCS Fundraising to assist us. This is the same company that ran the very successful diocesan capital campaign for priests a few years back.

A volunteer campaign committee has been organized and will begin contacting parishioners over the next few weeks. I just wanted to alert you to this.

This effort is designed to be a five-year campaign. So, today I am asking that you begin to prayerfully consider how you can help with a financial commitment of up to five years to make this project a reality.

As we move forward, please do not hesitate to contact me if you have questions or would like to learn more about what we are undertaking.

This is a time to celebrate our accomplishments and to look toward the future of St. Bernard Parish.

Thank you for your continued support. Together, we will be “Celebrating Our Past — Building for our Future.”




### KCs to lead rosary in May

Fr. Pat Higgins was pastor of St. Bernard Parish from 1981 until his retirement in 2002.


After his retirement, he was still very much a presence here as he continued to help out at weekend and weekday Masses.

## Stewardship

### Branching out isn't always what it's cracked up to be

“That’s a really beautiful tree branch. Man, would you look at the bark on that thing? The others are real duds, but that low-hanging branch has really got it all together.”

I’ve never heard anyone say this. Maybe I just need to hang out with more arborists, but I can’t recall ever hearing someone admire the particular beauty of a single branch.

When someone comments on a tree, it’s usually the whole tree — perhaps a visual element of it, like the color of the leaves or its height. But people don’t usually zero in on one branch.

Maybe that’s because usually, if one branch is looking a little weak, chances are every other branch is, too.

The Bible tells us that when we bear fruit as good everyday stewards, it is for the Father’s glory. We are the branch on His magnificent tree.

What we have is from Him, and what we do likewise points back to Him. We also tend to reflect how well the other branches around us are incorporating the nutrients coming their way.

That’s all fine and good in theory. In practice, it can be an arduous exercise in humility.

When I do something virtuous or charitable or kind, there is a part of me that wants to stand out for it. I think that’s true for all of us.

We’ve given of ourselves in some way or overcome some human temptation to accomplish a little bit of good in this world, and even though we know God sees us, we’d really love for everyone else to see it, too.

It’s a struggle, for sure. But we need to remember that our fruit belongs to the whole tree.— Tracy Earl Welliver, LPI



*Celebrating the Anniversary of Pope Francis' transformational encyclical, Laudato Si'.*

### **"Care for Creation" and Laudato Si' (Part I)**

- The Pope's encyclical, *Laudato Si'*, is a text of landmark significance in Catholic Social Teaching.
- Francis, like his thirteenth-century namesake, calls the earth our "common home", which is like our sister.
- But we are damaging this familial relationship as we seriously degrade the environment. In so doing, we are damaging our relationship with other humans, particularly those least equipped to adjust to the changing environment: the poor and future generations.
- The Pope encourages people to examine and change their lifestyles through sound ecological virtues, greater simplicity and less focus on material things.
- Francis extends an "urgent challenge to protect our common home ... to bring the whole human family together to seek a sustainable and integral development, for we know that things can change."
- By taking personal action and reducing excessive consumption and waste in our lives, we can meet our obligation to reduce our impact on the environment while creating a sustainable future for generations to follow.
