Pentecost is the birth of a new community, the Church.

This is the day that the Apostles left the upper room, where they had been hiding for fear of the Jews, and went out fearlessly to preach the Gospel to the world.

They could not have done this if they had not received the power of the Holy Spirit.

So today is the birthday of the Church. How it simply all began. The Church was born in frailty and weakness. It had no property, buildings or resources. Its only real resource was people, and there weren't many of them.

As they waited for the coming of the Holy Spirit, all of the followers could fit into one room. They knew each other's names.

The Church was very small then. But they had spirit, and were united in prayer and charity.

The Church is sustained, not by organizational structures and membership statistics, but by its prophets, martyrs, saints – and by us.

In this gathering, in this very church, this very day, we have all we need to experience what the Apostles experienced.

We have the essentials. We have the simplicity of the Gospel – a group of disciples listening to the Word of God and receiving Jesus in the bread of the Eucharist.

And we also have the Holy Spirit. It is the Holy Spirit who binds us together and helps us to witness to Christ as disciples in the world.

Just as spring enables the trees to blossom and grow, so the Holy Spirit enables us to be fruitful disciples of the Lord.

This afternoon, I will participate in the adult confirmation liturgy with Bishop Hying at St. Dennis Parish.

Congratulations to those from St. Bernard's (see photos and names below) who will be confirmed, and to all those from throughout the diocese who will be confirmed as well.

Let's all rejoice and be guided by the Spirit of the Living God. It is this Holy Spirit that brings love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.





Those of us in ministry love this saying: God doesn't call the equipped. He equips the called.

We all know that sort of queasy feeling we get in the pit of our stomachs when it becomes clear what we're supposed to do, in any situation.

It's that feeling of: Oh, no. Not me. Not now. I can't.

We've all got our list of reasons why not, don't we?

We do it for everything, from big life problems to small everyday choices. I'm not going to invite my neighbor to church because I don't want to come across as pushy.

I'm not going to make amends with my cousin because she'll just walk all over me again. I'm not going to say a Rosary tonight because I'm tired and it'll just stress me out.

However, even if we all put our lists of "reasons why we can't" together, I don't think any of us have reasons quite as valid as the apostles.

Their job was to convert the nations — and here they are, a bunch of fishermen who haven't been out of Judea, who speak only their own languages.

Were they supposed to preach the Gospel via a particularly compelling game of charades?

But even that big, giant, stop-you-dead-in-your-tracks Reason Why We Can't was nothing, because God had a plan.

He didn't call a bunch of equipped men. He called them, and He equipped them. Cue the tongues of fire!

God doesn't call us to do His will because we have what it takes. He calls us because He's ready to give us what it takes.






