

This weekend, we celebrate the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time.

The ability to hear and to speak are two great gifts.

Like all gifts, they can be taken for granted or even misused.

In today’s Gospel, we hear about the healing of the man who was blind and mute.

The miracle is not so much about the physical healing. Rather, it is about the opening of a person’s ears so that God’s word may be heard; and loosening a person’s tongue so that faith in Jesus may be proclaimed.

A person could have perfect hearing and yet not hear the word of God. And a person could have perfect speech and be unable to make an act of faith.

We need to be able to hear the word of God. Then we need to be able to profess that word with our lips.

Finally, we need to put it into practice in our lives.

The word of God, when heard and acted on, is like the seed falling on good soil. It makes our lives fruitful.

In light of this beautiful Gospel, over the past week technicians from My Hearing Loop LLC, of Sherrill, Iowa, have installed a hearing loop system at St. Bernard’s.

The hearing loop is an increasingly widespread technology that piggybacks onto our existing sound system to broadcast wirelessly to suitably equipped hearing aids and stand-alone earpieces to provide extra help for those who have trouble hearing in the church.

This installation was made possible by a generous grant from the Diocese of Madison Apostolate for Persons with Disabilities. We are extremely grateful for their help.

Hearing aid users should check whether their hearing aids have a “t-coil” installed.

If so, it will need to be activated. If not, check with your audiologist to see if a “t-coil” can be retrofitted. Often they can be.



I will have a handout with more specific instructions next week.

We are still in the final stages of getting everything set up properly for this wonderful addition to our liturgical experiences.


