



There are two kinds of faith.

The first is the faith of those who believe because they follow the traditions of their ancestors, strongly maintaining their tradition of faith. This could be called inherited faith.

The second is the faith of those who have gained it through reason and philosophical thinking. This could be called a personal faith.

Those who have an inherited faith have the advantage that they are not easily tempted. Their faith remains strong because of the traditions that they have inherited.

Those with a personal faith also have an advantage. They have discovered God with their reasoning and because of that their faith remains strong.

People who have gained their faith in both of these ways have every advantage.

They depend strongly on the traditions of their ancestors, while at the same time taking advantage of their ability to think things out for themselves.

They have the best and most perfect faith.

It is no longer enough to be born into faith.

An inherited faith is a second-hand faith and can be very empty. It is not enough to say, “My parents were believers.”


Every generation needs to be converted anew.

With the Church as our rock, we need to come up with our own answers, to be able to state our own values and beliefs as Christians. We have to make the faith our own.

Peter made a perfect profession of faith. He got it absolutely right – with his words. But when it came to acting on that faith, he failed.

His lowest point was when he denied he ever knew Jesus. This shows all of us that we need God’s grace, not only to profess the faith, but also to live it.

Wisconsin Catholic Charities request help for Afghan families

Many Afghan families have been transported to Fort McCoy, Wis., and Wisconsin Catholic Charities are assisting with their care and processing.

“Most of our help is focused on providing basic care and comfort to those who will be living at the base for the weeks and months to come,” said Karen Becker, development director for Catholic Charities of the Diocese of La Crosse.

All five Wisconsin Catholic Charities agencies are collaborating with the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops Migration and Refugee Services (MRS).

You can help by purchasing new items, such as child and adult diapers, wipes, masks, sweat pants, socks, rain ponchos and infant bodysuits (onesies) and sleepers.



Act to reduce food waste during the Season of Creation

The Season of Creation is a time to reflect on our relationship with the environment, how we live, and how our lifestyles impact the natural world, humans and other creatures inhabiting it. Christians are called to treat food like all of God’s gifts: with respect and gratitude, and to avoid overindulgence and waste. Food waste is particularly problematic because in landfills the waste decomposes and generates a potent climate warming greenhouse gas (methane).

Reducing food waste can save you significant money. The average U.S. family wastes \$1,600 of food each year. Use shopping lists to avoid duplicates and keep less food on hand. The “Best if Used By” dates on packages are NOT necessarily expiration dates. However, “Use-By” dates DO signify expiration dates.
