

This weekend’s Gospel deals with a very important subject, namely the exercise of authority.

It touches all of us. People seek authority for a variety of reasons.

Some like the power that goes with it, it makes them feel important. Others like the prestige it brings. Others like the higher salary.

All these reasons have one thing in common – authority is seen as an opportunity to promote oneself.

When James and John asked Jesus if they could have top places in Jesus’ kingdom they were thinking only of themselves.

They didn’t mind how much envy and resentment they aroused in their companions. They thought that Jesus’ kingdom was modeled on worldly kingdoms.

Those in high places would enjoy honor and glory and power. But Jesus told them that was not the way it worked.

In his kingdom, the greatest would be those who were willing to serve others rather than serve themselves.

Jesus abolished the distance between the master and the servant. In him, the two become one.

Even though Jesus was without sin, he experienced weakness and temptation as we do. He understands our weakness.

We should approach him with confidence, knowing that he can and will help us. To drink the cup of life, especially a cup made difficult by a life of sacrifice and service to others is to follow Christ. It is to choose true discipleship.

Remember as well that those who share the bitterness of the cross will also share the sweetness of his Easter victory.
