but gives grace to the humble.” - James 4:6*

The letter of James offers practical wisdom and advice. James puts the good of the community in the foreground and articulates the necessity of community between believers and confronts the main barriers to such community. Perhaps, it could be reduced to the distinctions between being proud and being humble. A recent Google search offers:

Pride

- Focuses on others failures.
- Self-righteous, overly critical and fault finding.
- Looks at their life through a telescope but others with a microscope.
- Looks down on those who are not as “spiritual” or “committed” as they are.
- Thinks they know who is truly proud and truly humble.
- Thinks everyone is privileged to have them involved.

Humility

- Realizes how far they fall short and have overwhelming sense of their need to grow.
- Compassionate and forgiving.
- Looks for the best in others.
- Seeks to win people, not arguments.
- Realizes only God knows a persons’ true motives.
- Leaves the judgment of the heart in God’s hands.
- Thinks they do not deserve the opportunities that God gives them.

We have 205 students that includes 37 confirmation students in our Faith Formation program, which is simply astounding and rivals our pre-Covid numbers! And we have forty catechists. Thanks to the leadership of Lisa Harms along with Deacon David Hendrickson and the catechists who have stepped forth to teach both in person and some online.

New this year, we have expanded our efforts in family ministry thanks to Christi Stutz as well as our high school youth ministry thanks to Katrina Tranel.

Our small group ministry continues to flourish. We have some fifteen groups meeting weekly along with a significant emphasis this fall upon developing future potential small group leaders. Thanks to Melanie Pfeil and our partnering with the efforts of Evangelical Catholic.



PLACING OTHERS FIRST

What does it mean to be God's servant? In essence, it means being willing to call the world back to its childlike innocence, showing all that a joy-filled playfulness has a place in life. The servant of God serves to foster the Kingdom of God. God's kingdom is not a sterile, unhappy, strict, and rigid reality. It is quite the opposite. It is a kingdom devoid of jealousy and selfish ambition where peace, gentleness, mercy, and good works abound. To be a servant of this kingdom means that selfish ambition must be set aside so that others can be first, and justice pursued at all cost. The prayer of this kind of servant is not focused on self-advancement or need. Rather, the servant's prayer seeks to detach from self-concern in order to be used by God. In this way, we who are servants can be inspired, guided, empowered, and led by God. We can then be used to lay the cornerstones of the kingdom: faith, hope, and love. It is upon these that God's firm dwelling is built. Accepting this call may place us last in the world's eyes but first in God's.


PRO-LIFE MARCH

TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

There is something about being first.

Whether it be first in line, first to be picked for the team, or the first one to finish their work, great satisfaction is achieved. Our egos love being first. It somehow sets us apart from everyone else, gives us a sense of pride and positions us to feel better than others. When we are first, we can glory in our efforts, skills, and achievements. Is not that what really matters? After all, we are taught from a very young age to be proficient, stay on top, be the best at what we do, and win the praise and esteem of others. This is the stuff that makes us successful and provides us with a comfortable, satisfying life.

Jesus wants none of it. All of the details we anguish over mean little to the kingdom of God. You want to be first? Then, be a servant and welcome a child. All of this is the opposite of our often vehement pursuits. If we are serious about following Jesus and living the Gospel, then we must put the needs of others before our own. If we continue to listen only to the noise of the world, we are going to continue to believe the illusions we inherit. Those illusions come in many forms, but all have things in common: me before you, being on top and not the bottom, us versus them, personal security over universal harmony and peace. When are we going to learn that always striving to be the best and first is an empty pursuit in our struggle for happiness? While satisfying our ego with this momentary boost of esteem may feel good for a moment, is it what we really desire?

If we can break from the world's noise and create a space of sacred silence in our lives, we can begin to listen and see that we are being called in another direction. What we really desire is not the bolstering of our egos but the innocence we lost somewhere along the way. When we can be playful, joyful, and even somewhat carefree, life is good. We want our relationships to work, a place to call home, and to live peaceful lives with our sisters and brothers. Only a servant can do this. The servant's prayer seeks to detach from self-concern in order to be used by God. Rather than worrying about being first and coming out on top, we can be inspired, guided, empowered, and led to do good works. Stop worrying about being first and put greater energy into feeling joy.




