FATHER RANDY WRITES . . .

Our First Love

Listen to what God is saying to us:

You are my child.

You are written in the palms of my hand.

You are hidden in the shadow of my hand.

I have molded you in the secret of the earth.

I have knitted you together in your mother's womb.

You belong to me.

I am yours.

You are mine.

I have called you from eternity and you are the one who is held safe and embraced in love from eternity to eternity. You belong to me. And I am holding you safe and I want you to know that whatever happens to you, I am always there. I was always there; I am always there; I always will be there and hold you in my embrace. You are mine. You are my child. You belong to my home. You belong to my intimate life and I will never let you go. I will be faithful to you.

The spiritual life starts at the place where you can hear God's voice. Where somehow you can claim that long before your father, your mother, your brother, your sister, your school, your church touched you, loved you, and wounded you - long before that, you were held safe in an eternal embrace. You were seen with eyes of perfect love long before you entered into the dark valley of life.

The spiritual life starts at the moment that you can go beyond all of the wounds and claim that there was a love that was perfect and unlimited, long before that perfect love became reflected in the imperfect and limited, conditional love of people.

The spiritual life starts where you dare to claim the first love. Love one another because I have loved you first.

December 12, Our Lady of Guadalupe

According to tradition, during a walk from his home village to Mexico City early on the morning of December 9, 1531 (the Feast of the Immaculate Conception in the Spanish Empire), the peasant Juan Diego saw a vision of a young girl of fifteen or sixteen, surrounded by light, on the slopes of the Hill of

Tepeyac. Speaking in the local language, Nahuatl, the Lady asked for a church to be built at that site in her honor, and from her words Juan Diego recognized her as the Virgin Mary.



Diego told his story to the Spanish Archbishop, Fray Juan de Zumárraga, who instructed him to return and ask the Lady for a miraculous sign to prove her claim. The Virgin told Juan Diego to gather some flowers from the top of Tepeyac Hill. It was winter and very late in the season for any flowers to bloom, but on the hilltop which was usually barren, Diego found Castillian roses, and the Virgin herself arranged them in his tilma or peasant cloak. When Juan Diego opened the cloak before Zumárraga on December 12, the flowers fell to the floor, and in their place was the Virgin of Guadalupe, miraculously imprinted on the fabric.

The iconography of the Virgin is impeccably Catholic. Miguel Sanchez, the author of the 1648 tract *Imagen de la Virgen María*, described her as the Woman of the Apocalypse from the New Testament's Revelation 12:1, "clothed with the sun, and the moon under her feet, and upon her head a crown of twelve stars," and she is also described as a representation of the Immaculate Conception.

Yet despite this orthodoxy the image also had a hidden layer of coded messages for the indigenous people of Mexico which goes a considerable way towards explaining her popularity. Her blue-green mantle was the color reserved for the divine couple Ometecuhtli and Omecihuatl; her belt is interpreted as a sign of pregnancy; and a cross-shaped image symbolizing the cosmos and called nahui-ollin is inscribed beneath the image's sash. She was called "mother of maguey," the source of the sacred beverage pulque "the milk of the Virgin," and the rays of light surrounding her doubled as maguey spines.

The tapestry is in remarkable shape some 500 years later and is displayed in the nearby Basilica of Guadalupe, now one of the most visited Catholic shrines in the world. The Virgin of Guadalupe is Mexico's most popular religious and cultural image, with the titles "Queen of Mexico," "Empress of the Americas," and "Patroness of the Americas."

IRA CHARITABLE ROLLOVER FACTS

- If you are 70 ½ or older, you can give up to \$100,000 directly from your IRA to a qualified charity such as your parish.
- The transfer must come from the plan administrator directly to the charity.
- The gift can be counted toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD).
- Gifts can be a portion of the RMD, all of the RMD or more than the RMD up to \$100,000.
- Charitable rollover gifts can **not** be made from a 401(k) or a 403(b) plan. (Needs to be transferred first to an IRA; consult your accountant/tax attorney for specifics.)
- These gifts can **not** be used to fund charitable remainder trusts or charitable gift annuities. (Saint Dennis is a qualified charitable organization.)
- Donors using this type of gifting do **not** receive a charitable deduction – it provides a reduction in taxable income – a specific IRA rollover acknowledgement is necessary.
- IRA assets may be advisable to use for gifting since they can have a high tax effect on your estate.
- Transferring stock to Saint Dennis could avoid possible capital gains. Saint Dennis uses Charles Schwab account number 6109-9076.



O ANTIPHONS

This week we also begin to hear the "O Antiphons" as the verse for the Alleluia for the Gospel at Mass and the verse for the Magnificat at evening prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours. These O Antiphons proclaimed during the last seven days of Advent, anticipate the attributes of the Messiah as foretold in the Old Testament Scriptures and then proclaim them as titles for our Savior. Each one refers to the prophecy of Isaiah of the coming of the Messiah.



- December 17 - **O Sapientia** (O Wisdom): You govern all creation with your strong yet tender care.
- December 18 - **O Adonai** (O Lord): You showed yourself to Moses in the burning bush, who gave him holy laws.
- December 19 - **O Radix Jesse** (O Root of Jesse): You have been raised up as a sign for all peoples.
- December 20 - **O Clavis David** (O Key of David): You control at your will the gate of Heaven.
- December 21 - **O Oriens** (O Dayspring): Come shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.
- December 22 - **O Rex Gentium** (O King of the nations): King of the nations, the only joy of every human heart.
- December 23 - **O Emmanuel** (O God with us): King and lawgiver, desire of the nations, Savior of all people, come and set us free.

Years ago, these titles were often depicted in the ornaments hung on Jesse Trees. Enjoy this special period of Advent preparation as the Octave before Christmas.






