FATHER RANDY WRITES . . .

“Mary set out in haste.” - Luke 1:39

Mary has just learned she is pregnant with the Savior of the world. To the naked eye, her pregnancy is unplanned, unexpected, and unthinkable. Mosaic Law had rules on how to handle such situations: death by stoning or to be shunned and sent away. Mary is a young teenager and now she is pregnant. What does Mary do? Sit down and talk things out with her parents? No. Talk to Joseph about what they are going to do? No. Mary, filled with the Holy Spirit, sets out in haste for the hill country of Judah.

Mary has learned that her revered relative Elizabeth is also pregnant. Thus, the 130-mile journey, south of Jerusalem, did not take Mary to Judah, it took her to Elizabeth. The Greek expression for haste denotes a driven diligence much like in 2 Peter 1:5 and Jude 1:3. Elizabeth is pregnant and needs help. Mary has a driven diligence in her haste, for she wants to be present to Elizabeth.

There is a difference between presents and **presence**. Sure, the words sound the same, but we all know they are completely different. Although Mary had a lot on her mind, she wanted to be **present** to Elizabeth. Mary wanted to be there because Mary wanted to be there. With a frenzied pace driving our lives it is hard to “be where you are.” We can be with people, but because of our own haste, often times it is hard to be **present** to the people we are with. As the secular Christmas season demands more of us, our haste increases. We have more presents, but we have less **presence**.

Today, be **present** to people, not haste. Today “be where you are.” Focus on people. Focus on **presence**. Focus on God’s presence.

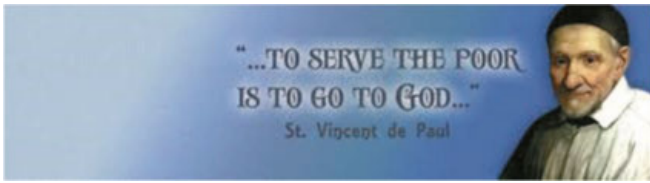

SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL CONFERENCE AT SAINT DENNIS

- Single mother 8 months pregnant with two other small children had a fire in their apartment. Unable to work due to fire loss and reestablishing a new apartment. She was helped with new furniture and two months' rent through multiple sources.
- Single male living in car working part-time. He needed his car repaired so he could continue to go to work. He was helped with car repair.
- Single mom with school age children trying to work full-time but struggles paying for childcare. She was helped with a childcare bill.

The Saint Dennis Saint Vincent de Paul Conference has recently come to the end of its fiscal year. Although the pandemic has altered the way those in need are visited, our Conference continues to engage with our neighbors by sharing in their story and helping in many small ways. This past year the number of requests for assistance have been down but the requests were for larger amounts. The generosity of Saint Dennis Parish allowed the Conference to help people more fully with diverse needs and in greater amounts.

This past year 139 visits were made assisting 401 people. The Conference donated 1018 hours of service.

CARE FOR CREATION

Laudato Si' on the Incarnation

In the Encyclical, *Laudato Si': on Care for Our Common Home*, Pope Francis

encourages us to be open to awe and wonder when viewing the natural world that God created, in which He was incarnated, and of which we are part. (LS, 11)

Further, he reflects, "In the Christian understanding of the world, the destiny of all Creation is bound up with the mystery of Christ, present from the beginning: 'All things have been created through him and for him.' (Col 1:16) The prologue of the Gospel of John 1:1-18 reveals Christ's creative work as the Divine Word (Logos). But then, unexpectedly, the prologue goes on to say that this same Word 'became flesh.' (John 1:14) One Person of the Trinity entered into the created cosmos, throwing in his lot with it, even to the cross. From the beginning of the world, but particularly through the Incarnation, the mystery of Christ is at work in a hidden manner in the natural world as a whole, without thereby impinging on its autonomy." (LS, 99)

FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Saint Augustine tells us that a “Christian is a mind through which Christ thinks, a heart through which Christ loves, a voice through which Christ speaks and a hand through which Christ helps.” As we look around and out at the world, we do not have to search too far before we come face to face with inequity and injustice. There is so much unfairness, prejudice, anger, hatred, violence, and want. The stories of human heartache, people being hurt, deprived of life’s necessities, loneliness, and sickness are far too commonplace. For many of the world’s ills, the vices of greed, lust, pride, gluttony, and jealousy are clearly among the more significant root causes.

Why does not God just step in and fix this mess? After all, God created this world, and one would hope that he would step up and take some measure of responsibility for it! Once we sit with this thinking for a while, we can begin to realize just how flawed it really is. God did take responsibility and God did fix the problem! God sent us Jesus Christ as the divine solution to the world’s ills. It is not God who has shirked responsibility, we have. We are the ones who continually fail to set our own personal needs, wants, and securities aside so that One more powerful than us can use us.

Mary had to set her needs aside in order for the Son of God to come into the world. Put simply, Mary listened and believed. Having opened herself to being an instrument of the Divine, God could use her as his mind, heart, voice, and hand. She became God’s vessel so that God’s greatness could reach the ends of the earth and peace could come upon the world. God’s fix for the world’s difficulties is you and me. We are the ones who confess that Jesus Christ came into the world as the Son of God, the Prince of Peace, and herald of justice. All we have to do is believe, as did Mary, that what has been spoken to us by the Lord will be fulfilled. Then, we can step aside and be the Christians we claim to be. What a difference it would make if every person who professed to be Christian truly understood that their one and only vocation is to be God’s instrument. What a beautiful, equitable, and just world it would be.

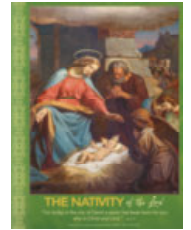

THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD



“He so loved us that for our sake He was made man in time, through Whom all times were made; was in the world less in years than His servants, though older than the world itself in His eternity; was made man, Who made man; was created of a mother, whom He created; was carried by hands which He formed; nursed at the breasts which He had filled; cried in the manger in wordless infancy, He the Word without Whom all human eloquence is mute.” (Saint Augustine, Sermon 188) The miracle of what happens at Christmas is truly an awesome mystery. Revealed in the silent ordinariness of life is God’s intimate love for humanity and all that he made. The Word, existing for all time, comes and dwells among us. God kisses us. We can seek and soar with playful delight as a joy never known before fills our heart.

Joy is best expressed through dance. There is just something truly wonderful about the self-abandon a beautiful melodic dance reveals. If we are able to let go and really be free, it celebrates life in a way few other experiences really can. With the birth of Jesus Christ, God takes the Divine Dance to a deeper and more tangible level. We can now not only see what we believe but believe what we see! This most perfect dance is a call to beauty, innocence, truth, purpose, hope, faith, and love. Today we know, beyond doubt, that we are a necessary part of God’s beautifully choreographed masterpiece of life and not just a random happening without real intent or purpose. We are loved, treasured, and blessed.

Accepting the truth of God’s birth in time we also accept an invitation to dance with God. We can let go of what tethers us to anxious concerns and superficial securities. Throw caution to the wind and go with God. We have been blessed with talents, gifts, and life eternal. Follow the rhythm of the dance with joy and listen to what the Word who became flesh tells us about what the next steps can be. Today, Heaven remains the same, but Earth has been profoundly changed.

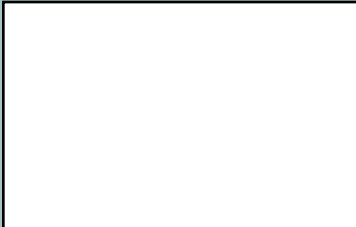

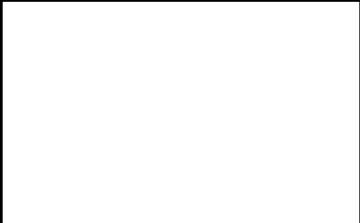
