#### SAINT STEPHEN

#### Feast Day December 26

The Acts of the Apostles tells the story of Saint Stephen, the first Christian martyr. A man filled with grace and power, he worked great wonders among the people. Some Jews debated with St. Stephen but could not match his wisdom and spirit. Eventually, a charge of blasphemy was brought up against him, and the local population demanded that he be tried and sentenced. He was seized and carried before the Sanhedrin. Despite the danger he faced, in front of the Sanhedrin and his accusers, Saint Stephen gave a long speech about the history of Israel and the blessings that God had given upon His chosen people. He talked about how Israel had become disobedient despite God's abundant mercy. This enraged his accusers, and eventually the crowd dragged him out of the city and stoned him to death.

Even in his final moments, Saint Stephen displayed great forgiveness and even asked God not to hold the sins of his attackers against them. Hundreds of years after his death, he is still a role model for us to follow.

#### FATHER RANDY WRITES . . .

"Put on, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. . ." - Colossians 3:12-13

As the feast of the Holy Family arrives we receive instructions for the lived response of faith. Saint Paul instructs us

"Put on as God's chosen holy and beloved."

Remember who you are first and then dress appropriately.

<u>Chosen</u> is who you are by the Maker of the Universe, the one who created the heavens and the earth chose you to reflect His glory.

<u>Holy</u> is to be set apart, to be set apart for the glory of God. Just as God called Abraham and Sarah and set them apart and later the nation Israel, so God has called you to be holy. To be holy is to be about living, serving, witnessing, dedicating your family, your finances and your future to the work of God.

<u>Beloved</u> is who you are, this is not about your earning God's special status of love nor is it about being "good enough" to be in the top 10 of God's beloved. Rather, it entails being embraced by the truth of "God loves you not because you are good, but because God loves you, you are good."

As we come to remember whose we are and the promises that await us, then we "dress accordingly."

# SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL CONFERENCE AT SAINT DENNIS

- Single mother 8 months pregnant with two other small children had a fire in their apartment. Unable to work due to fire loss and reestablishing a new apartment. She was helped with new furniture and two months' rent through multiple sources.
- Single male living in car working part-time. He needed his car repaired so he could continue to go to work. He was helped with car repair.
- Single mom with school age children trying to work full-time but struggles paying for childcare. She was helped with a childcare bill.

The Saint Dennis Saint Vincent de Paul Conference has recently come to the end of its fiscal year. Although the pandemic has altered the way those in need are visited, our Conference continues to engage with our neighbors by sharing in their story and helping in many small ways. This past year the number of requests for assistance have been down but the requests were for larger amounts. The generosity of Saint Dennis Parish allowed the Conference to help people more fully with diverse needs and in greater amounts.

This past year 139 visits were made assisting 401 people. The Conference donated 1018 hours of service.

# THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY AND JOSEPH

Families can be very difficult things to

negotiate. This is true not only of our families of origin, the current family of which we are a part, the family of our Church, our society, and our global family as well. Everything human can be found in family stories. Those stories speak of wonderful life-giving successes as well as painful spirit-robbing abuses. Our greatest joys and our greatest wounds are usually connected with the experience of family. Our needs, experiences, and unresolved baggage often color what we bring to our familiar relationships. They contribute to our level of defensiveness, how guarded and protected we become, and what prejudices we believe.

In order to break the cycle of dysfunction we have to remember that it is not only by human effort that we negotiate the difficult and challenging events of our lives. There is a Divine Effort at work as well. For sure, the human effort can create quite a mess and easily destroy lives. This is true of any family with which we are associated. Today's Feast of the Holy Family serves to help us understand that there is a Divine Story being told as well. It is a story of perseverance in the face of hardship, determination in the face of despair, healing when we see nothing but wounds, and light where there is darkness.

Do we believe that God is always working, guiding, restoring, and leading? Unless we do, we will never be free from the imperfections and wounds that bind us and never be able to understand what it really means to forgive. Pope Francis tells us that the "light which comes from the Holy Family encourages us to offer human warmth to other families." While this is most certainly true, we can only really begin to do this when we realize that we are still works in progress, not anchored to the wounds and sins of our past, and still a leading star in God's continually unfolding story of love. The Holy Family persevered and radiated warmth because they knew they were not alone. We can too.

Have you and your spouse been consumed with the busyness that often comes with this time of year? Find a moment to reconnect as a couple and enjoy each other's company.


