

# FATHER RANDY WRITES ...

"Peter proceeded to speak to those gathered in the house of Cornelius, saying: 'In truth, I see that God shows no partiality . . .'" - Acts 10:34

Peter needs Cornelius as much as Cornelius needs Peter. Each year on the feast of the Baptism of the Lord we are invited to revisit the encounter of Peter and Cornelius in Acts of the Apostles 10.

Peter basically walks into Cornelius' home and says, "Before yesterday, I considered all of you unclean but now I have changed my mind." Cornelius is known as a man of prayer, great generosity, cares for the poor, and yet a life transformation is required. It is the preaching of Peter that awakens the gift of the Holy Spirit and Cornelius, and his household is baptized. It is good to reflect upon the significance of being baptized in the Holy Spirit and its effects on one's life.

Reflect upon:

- Do you look at yourself and feel continually unclean or unworthy of God's love? If so, remind yourself often that it is God who is pursuing you and has first loved you!
- Peter had a shred of racism within himself. This event is years after the resurrection and Peter believed the Gospel in its entirety and yet he himself needed transformation. Recognize the need for conversion in your own life, perhaps by people who are very different from you culturally.
- One of the effects of Cornelius' baptism was the gift of the Holy Spirit. As the Holy Spirit takes root in you, it changes how you worship. Until God's love is the praise of your life, you have not really changed. Where are you being invited to let go of control and to worship the One who is in control?

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased.
