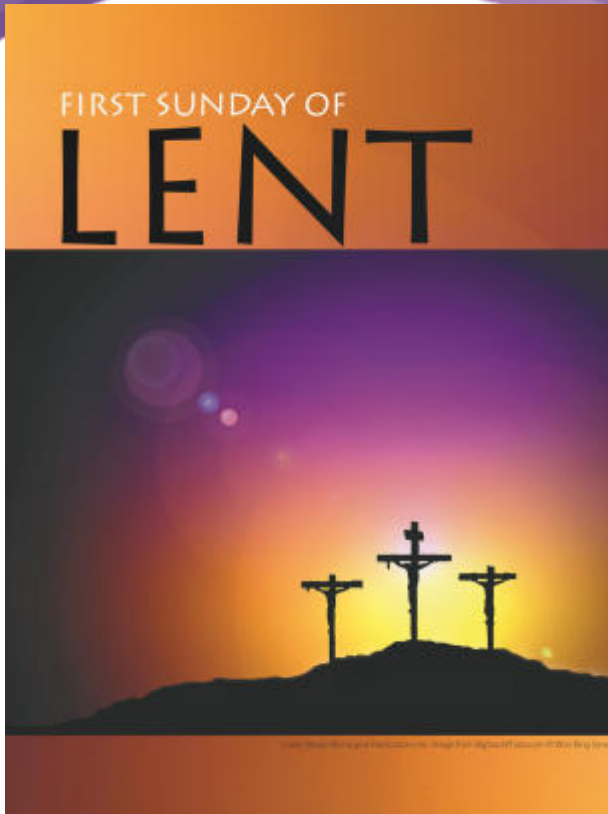

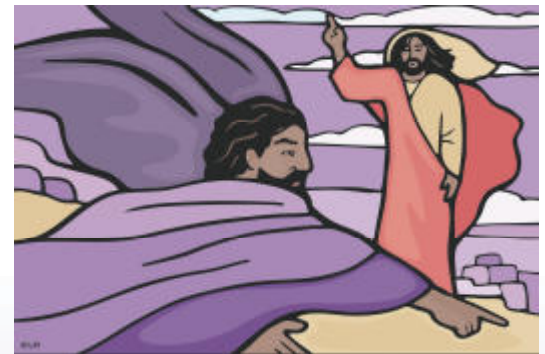
**Good Shepherd Parish Prayer**

**Cycles of Faith - 1st Sunday of Lent**

As we enter into this Lenten season of penance and self-denial, we're reminded that the God we follow is no stranger to these things. In this Sunday's Gospel, we see the temptations of Jesus which have parallels throughout Scripture and in our own lives. The apostle John warns against temptations to sensual lust, enticement of the eyes, and a pretentious life (cf. 1 John 2:16). Before Eve plucks the fruit from the tree, she hears it is good for food, pleasing to the eyes, and desirable for gaining wisdom (cf. Genesis 3:6). The temptations of Jesus are our own.

"Turn these stones to bread." Here is the lure of bodily comfort, like good food or sensual lust. It's the simplest of temptations because it's instinctual. We want good for our bodies! But there may be times these bodily goods don't serve the higher good for our souls. The leap "from the temple parapet" would entice the eye of the person watching. A feat like this would prove Jesus' Messianic ability. His popularity could be a shortcut to the cross. We might not be daredevils, but we want people to like us and be impressed by us. Do we sacrifice our values along the way? To "bow and worship" the devil - and so claim power and a pretentious life - seems like a dramatic temptation. Not everyone may feel enticed by power in the professional sense, but all of us want control. A volunteer team can feel just as intense as the boardroom! How often do we prefer to be in control of our lives (and perhaps even the lives of others), rather than allow God to be God?

When we consider areas of temptation and sin, it's not to feel ashamed. The temptation in the desert reminds us that we are not alone and that the strength of Jesus can be our strength, too.

**Penitential Disciplines of Lent**

The Christian faithful, during Lent, are clearly conscious of the need to turn the mind towards those realities which really count, which require Gospel commitment and integrity of life which, through self denial of those things which are superfluous, are translated into good works and solidarity with the poor and needy (Directory on Popular Piety and the Liturgy, #125).

In addition to choosing their own penitential practices, Catholics are also asked to observe the practices of fast and abstinence during the 40 days of Lent. The Lenten Fast and Abstinence Regulations are as follows:

1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent, including Good Friday.
2. Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday and are under 59 years of age are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
3. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday Fasts: only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other smaller meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
4. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.

**March 10—Lent—Cactus**



The first Sunday of Lent we always read a version of Jesus' temptation in the desert. Right after Jesus is baptized by John the Baptist, Jesus goes out into the desert to pray and fast. While he is there the devil comes to him and tempts him. Our season of Lent is based on these 40 days Jesus spent in prayer. Like Jesus' time in the desert, the Lenten season calls us to a deeper level of prayer and sacrifice. The sacrifices we make may be monetary (by donating alms to those in need) or of comfort (like not eating meat on Fridays or giving up our favorite food). How do you think making these small sacrifices can help us draw closer to God?

**Confirmation Question**

**If you die celibate do you automatically go to heaven?**

The reason anyone goes to heaven depends not on one's sex life, but has to do with the death of Jesus on the cross. Through Jesus' sacrificial death on the cross, he has opened up the doors of heaven to us all regardless of how we live out our sexual vocations. Celibacy is a gift that provided a witness to the Church that the joys and blessings of marital life that are available to us in this life are only a small taste of what we can expect to experience in the life to come. But celibacy is by no means a guarantee of achieving heavenly bliss. It is not inconceivable that a person can embrace a celibate lifestyle and reject God in other facets of his or her life and give into other temptations such as power and pride. Every person is called to live a life of chastity. This means for those who are married to remain faithful to their spouse, for the single to reserve sexual intimacy for marriage, and for those who have taken a vow of celibacy to forgo sexual intimacy all together. People can and do fail at living a chaste life, but Jesus offers forgiveness to all who have fallen. It is Christ's mercy and grace that allows us to spend all eternity with God in paradise. How we live our lives now is a sign of where we will spend the next life, but the only guarantee we have of heaven is to cling to Jesus in this life through loving God and each other.

**Nopal:** El primer domingo de Cuaresma siempre leemos una versión de la tentación de Jesús en el desierto. Justo después de que Jesús es bautizado por Juan el Bautista, Jesús sale al desierto a orar y ayunar. Mientras él está allí, el diablo viene a él y lo tienta. Nuestra temporada de Cuaresma se basa en esos 40 días que Jesús pasó en oración. Al igual que el tiempo de Jesús en el desierto, la temporada de Cuaresma nos llama a un nivel más profundo de oración y sacrificio. Los sacrificios que hacemos pueden ser monetarios (donando a los necesitados) o de comodidad (como no comer carne los viernes o renunciar a nuestra comida favorita). **¿Cómo crees que hacer estos pequeños sacrificios puede ayudarnos a acercarnos más a Dios?**

### Viernes de Pescado durante Cuaresma

Viernes de Cenas de pescado, de 4:30 pm a 7:30 pm, en el comedor de nuestra Iglesia San Santiago (1128 St James Ct Madison) el 15 de marzo, 22 de marzo, 29 de marzo y 5 de abril. ## Prácticas Penitenciaras de Cuaresma

### Ayuno

La ley del ayuno requiere que el católico, desde los 18 hasta los 59 años de edad, reduzca la cantidad de comida usual. La Iglesia define esta práctica como una comida principal más dos comidas pequeñas que sumadas no sobrepasen la primera en cantidad. Este ayuno es obligatorio el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo.

### Abstinencia

La ley de abstinencia exige a un católico de 14 años de edad y hasta su muerte, a abstenerse de comer carne los viernes, en honor a la Pasión de Jesús del Viernes Santo. Como carne se considera a la carne y órganos de mamíferos y aves de corral. También se encuentran prohibidas las sopas, caldos, cremas y salsas que se hacen a partir de ellos. Los peces de mar y de agua dulce, anfibios, reptiles y mariscos están permitidos, así como los productos derivados de animales como margarina y gelatina sin sabor a carne.

### Quiénes están excluidos del ayuno y la abstinencia

Además de los que están excluidos por su edad, también se incluyen a los que tienen problemas mentales, los enfermos, quienes se encuentran en estado de debilidad, mujeres embarazadas o en la etapa de lactancia de acuerdo a la alimentación que necesitan para alimentar a sus hijos, obreros de acuerdo a su exigencia física, invitados a comer que no pueden excusarse sin ofender gravemente o sin causar enemistad, u otras situaciones morales o físicas que imposibiliten mantener el ayuno.

### Si mueres célibe, ¿automáticamente vas al cielo?

La razón por la que alguien va al cielo no depende de la vida sexual, sino que tiene que ver con la muerte de Jesús en la cruz. A través de la muerte sacrificial de Jesús en la cruz, nos ha abierto las puertas del cielo sin importar cómo vivimos nuestras vocaciones sexuales. El celibato es un regalo que da testimonio a la Iglesia de que las alegrías y bendiciones de la vida conyugal que tenemos disponibles en esta vida, son solo una pequeña muestra de lo que podemos experimentar en la vida venidera. Pero el celibato no es de ninguna manera una garantía de alcanzar la dicha celestial. No es inconcebible que una persona pueda adoptar un estilo de vida célibe y rechazar a Dios en otras facetas de su vida y ceder a otras tentaciones como el poder y el orgullo. Cada persona está llamada a vivir una vida de castidad. Esto significa que aquellos que están casados permanezcan fieles a su cónyuge, que los solteros reserven la intimidad sexual para el matrimonio, y aquellos que han hecho un voto de celibato renuncien a la intimidad sexual. Podemos fracasar en vivir una vida casta, pero Jesús ofrece perdón si caemos. Es la misericordia y la gracia de Cristo que nos permite pasar toda la eternidad con Dios en el paraíso. La forma en que vivimos nuestras vidas ahora es un signo de dónde pasaremos la próxima vida, pero la única garantía que tenemos del cielo es aferrarnos a Jesús en esta vida a través de amar a Dios y a los demás.
