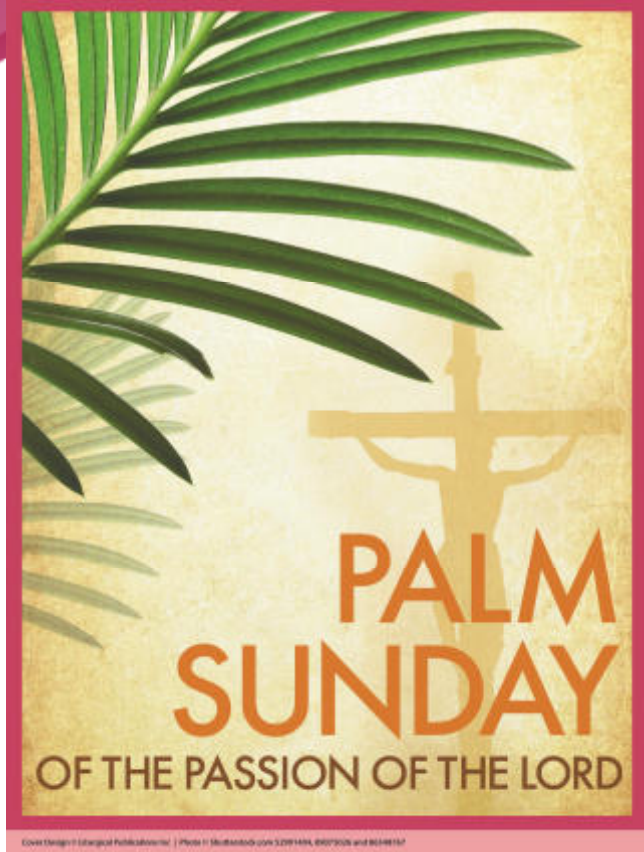

**Cycles of Faith - Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord**

Jesus warns us in the Gospel of Matthew, "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." It is an invitation to a way of life, and a plan that leads to holiness. But make no mistake, it is a warning as well. The cross is a sign of victory, but only in light of the Resurrection. Alone, it is a symbol of ultimate sacrifice: the sacrifice of Jesus Christ for a fallen world, and the sacrifice we are called to make to truly follow him.

The power of this symbol has been diminished in popular culture. It is often used in fashion and simple wall art and on bumper stickers and T-shirts, sometimes with Christian clichés and sometimes not. But the cross is something so much more. It is a reminder of the pain, suffering, and death of one who loved us so much that he would give his very life for us. It is our God on that cross. It is God who cries out in despair, feeling the ultimate depth of human emotion. And there lies the key for us in trying to live this life of carrying our crosses.

For those who suffer the death of a loved one, the Father lost his Son. For those who suffer the ravages of disease, his body was broken, beaten, and pierced. For those who feel they have no way out - whether due to prisons that are physical or prisons that are of the mind - he hung on a cross and cried out, "Why?" For those who feel alone and abandoned, he hung on a tree where no one could comfort him, not even his own mother. He has walked in all our shoes, and now we are called to walk in his. In the cross, we find solidarity with the human condition. In an empty tomb, we find our hope.

**Holy Week Prayer**

Dear Jesus, in this Holy Week, we remember the time from your triumphal entry as a king in Jerusalem to your tragic death as a criminal on Golgotha.

In this week, give us the grace to imitate you in our everyday lives.

As you washed the feet of your apostles, help us to serve others without thought of ourselves.

As you forgave Peter for his denial of you, help us to forgive those who have wronged us.

As your apostles were faced with their own weaknesses, help us know our own limits, and our need for your aid.

Most of all, give us the grace to remember that you died for love of us. Amen.

**Confirmation Question:****Why did Jesus have to die?**

Jesus died because He loves us. One of the most outrageous claims we make as Christians is that we worship a God who loves us so much that God would rather die than spend an eternity without us. As humans, we have a physical part (our body) and a spiritual part (our soul) that make us up. When we die these two parts are separated. This is not what God intended, but is a result of sin. Through sin we reject our very nature and turn our back on God and who God created us to be. In a very real way sin de-creates us and we become less than what God intended us to be. In short, we die because of sin (not personal sin, but the original sin committed by our first parents, in which we all share). Rather than leave us in our state of self destruction, God chose to take on human flesh in the person of Jesus Christ. And as a human Jesus experienced all the joys and sorrows that the human condition has to offer including our ultimate end of suffering death. But because Jesus never sinned, His death is able to act like a healing balm that can remedy the fatal condition of being human. This is what St. Paul meant when he said, "For just as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous (Romans 5:19)." We all still die, but Jesus' death opens the gates of heaven for all of us so that we may spend eternity in God presence. See your YOUcat § 94-101 for more details.

**Passport Symbol: Palm Sunday - Sacred Heart**

At Mass this week for the Gospel story we listened to the Passion narrative and heard how Jesus was unjustly put to death and died for our sins. So our symbol for this week is the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This image symbolizes Jesus' heart which is aflame with love for us as demonstrated through his sacrifice on the cross. The crown of thorns surrounding the heart also reminds us of the passion narrative and how we worship a God who loves us so much that God would rather suffer and die than be separated from us. Think back to the start of the lent and the little sacrifices you said you were going to make. How did you do? How have you grown closer to God over this Lenten season?

"¡Hosanna al hijo de David! ¡Bendito sea el que viene en el nombre del Señor! ¡Hosanna en lo más alto de los cielos!" (Mateo 21:9). Hoy inicia la Semana Santa o Semana Mayor. En este hermoso tiempo la Iglesia en su liturgia nos invita a tener la oportunidad de detenernos en nuestro camino para reflexionar en las cosas que de verdad valen la pena. Hoy, se conmemora la entrada triunfal de Jesús en Jerusalén. Estamos a punto de celebrar los misterios de la pasión, muerte y resurrección de nuestro

único Salvador. En esta Semana Santa, busquemos momentos apropiados para agradecer al Señor todo lo que ha hecho por nosotros.

¿Con qué disposición podremos vivir esta Semana Santa? ¿Qué podremos aportar por los más necesitados? El Papa Francisco nos invita a lo siguiente:

Jesús entra en Jerusalén. Jesús ha despertado en el corazón tantas esperanzas, sobre todo entre la gente humilde, simple, pobre, olvidada, esa que no cuenta a los ojos del mundo. ## Pregunta de Confirmación

### ¿Por qué tuvo que morir Jesús?

Jesús murió porque nos ama. Una de las afirmaciones más fuertes que hacemos como cristianos es que adoramos a un Dios que nos ama tanto que prefirió morir, antes que pasar una eternidad sin nosotros. Como humanos, tenemos una parte física (nuestro cuerpo) y una parte espiritual (nuestra alma) que nos conforman. Cuando morimos estas dos partes se separan. Esto no es lo que Dios quiso, pero es el resultado del pecado. A través del pecado, rechazamos nuestra propia naturaleza y le damos la espalda a Dios y a quien Dios nos creó para ser. De una manera muy real, el pecado nos destruye y nos convertimos en menos de lo que Dios quiso que fuéramos. En resumen, morimos por el pecado (no el pecado personal, sino el pecado original cometido por nuestros primeros padres, en el que todos compartimos). En lugar de dejarnos en nuestro estado de autodestrucción, Dios eligió asumir la carne humana en la persona de Jesucristo. Así, Jesús humano experimentó todas las alegrías y tristezas que la condición humana tiene para ofrecer, incluido nuestro fin último de sufrir la muerte. Pero debido a que Jesús nunca pecó, su muerte puede actuar como un bálsamo curativo que puede remediar la condición fatal de ser humano. Esto es lo que quiso decir San Pablo cuando dijo: "Porque así como por la desobediencia de un hombre, muchos se hicieron pecadores, por la obediencia de un hombre, muchos serán hechos justos (Romanos 5:19)". , Por eso, la muerte de Jesús abre las puertas del cielo para todos nosotros para que podamos pasar la eternidad en la presencia de Dios.
