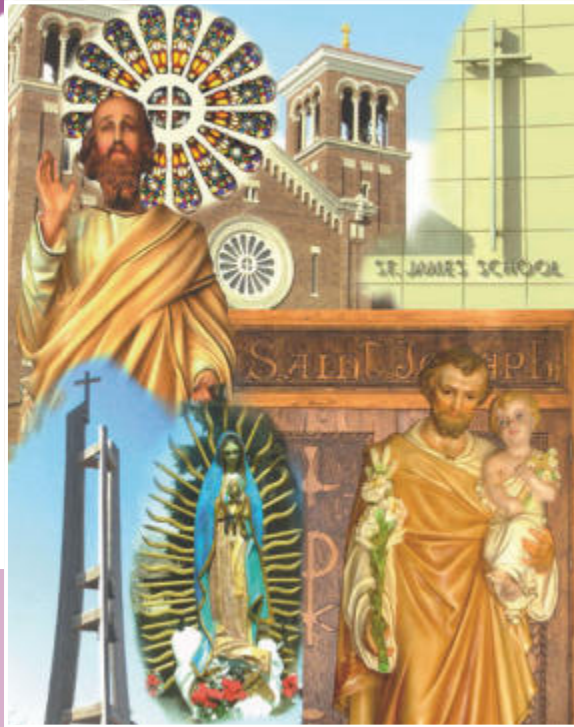

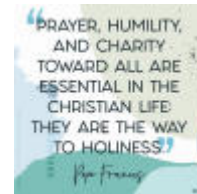

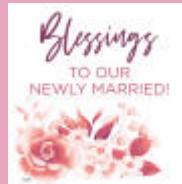

Evangelization

How Should We Evangelize?

Talk to People about Jesus, Part 1

The witness of a holy life is a good beginning, but it is absolutely necessary also to use words. Why are words so important? In the first place, the spoken word allows the witness of a holy life to be correctly understood and interpreted. But even more importantly, the preached word is the seed by which faith is sown in the heart. As St. Paul says to the Romans:

Everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord will be saved. But how are men to call upon him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without a preacher? ... So, faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes by the preaching of Christ. (Rom 10:13–14, 17)

Hence the Second Vatican Council stresses the inadequacy of silent witness alone:

An apostolate of this kind does not consist only in the witness of one's way of life; a true apostle looks for opportunities to announce Christ by words addressed either to non-believers with a view to leading them to faith, or to the faithful with a view to instructing, strengthening, and encouraging them to a more fervent life. (Vatican II, *Apostolicam Actuositatem*, 6.)

And Pope St. Paul VI makes the same point in *Evangelii Nuntiandi*:

Nevertheless, this always remains insufficient, because even the finest witness will prove ineffective in the long run if it is not explained, justified—what Peter called always having “your answer ready for people who ask you the reason for the hope that you all have”—and made explicit by a clear and unequivocal proclamation of the Lord Jesus. The Good News proclaimed by the witness of life sooner or later has to be proclaimed by the word of life. ***There is no true evangelization if the name, the teaching, the life, the promises, the kingdom and the mystery of Jesus of Nazareth, the Son of God are not proclaimed.*** (St. Paul VI, *Evangelii Nuntiandi*, 22.)

However, we must also remember that evangelization is most effective in the context of personal relationship. God created us in his own image and likeness (Gen 1:26); and he is in himself a Trinitarian relationship of persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit; hence it follows that we too have been made for relationships. What this means for evangelization, then, is that more programs (by themselves) are not the answer.

Rather, in a culture that is becoming increasingly isolated and lonely, we must learn anew to build healthy Christ-centered relationships, both with other believers so that we will find strength in authentic Christian community and with non-believers so as to introduce them to the God who dwells within us by grace. In short, in an individualistic culture where many people instinctively distrust institutions, including religious institutions like the Church, our evangelical efforts must be rooted in authentic personal relationships and Christian friendship, much like that of Jesus with the twelve apostles.

Next week we will look at examples of how we can talk to people about Jesus.

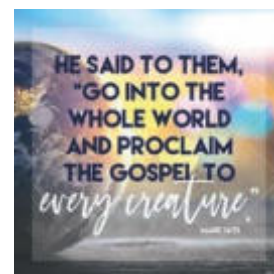
Adoration

Vivimos en una sociedad llena de celos, envidia, rivalidades y un ego de superioridad y control sobre los demás. Con poquito poder que se le otorgue a la persona, le basta para mandar y ejercer poder sobre el otro, y lo triste es que muchas veces lo vemos como algo habitual y normal. Hoy, la Palabra de Dios nos habla de lo

contrario. Las lecturas nos hablan de la sabiduría de Dios y de cómo aplicarla aquí en la tierra. Por sus frutos los conocerán, es decir por hacer el bien, por ser comprensivos, amantes de la paz, dóciles, sinceros y llenos de misericordia. Pero, ¿existe la misericordia?

El Evangelio nos narra, que Jesús instrúa a sus discípulos de cómo iba ser su pasión, y ellos no entendían sus palabras. Ellos, en cambio, estaban enfrascados en una conversación contraria a los deseos de Jesús: ¿Quién de ellos era el más importante? La raíz del problema está en el corazón humano, pensamos y actuamos al contrario de lo que Dios nos pide. Casi siempre se impone la voluntad sobre los demás y esto puede ser sutilmente o de forma agresiva. Jesús tiene la respuesta correcta a toda inquietud mundana. Basta con escuchar su Palabra: "Si alguno quiere ser el primero, que se haga el último y el servidor de todos" (Marcos 9:35). Y agrega algo más para que quede claro: "El que recibe a un niño como este en mi nombre, me recibe a mí; y el que me recibe, no me recibe a mí, sino al que me ha enviado" (Marcos 9:37). Ojalá, que la participación en la Eucaristía, ya sea personalmente o por medio del internet, tenga como fin una sola cosa: la conversión del corazón.

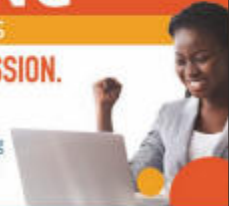
