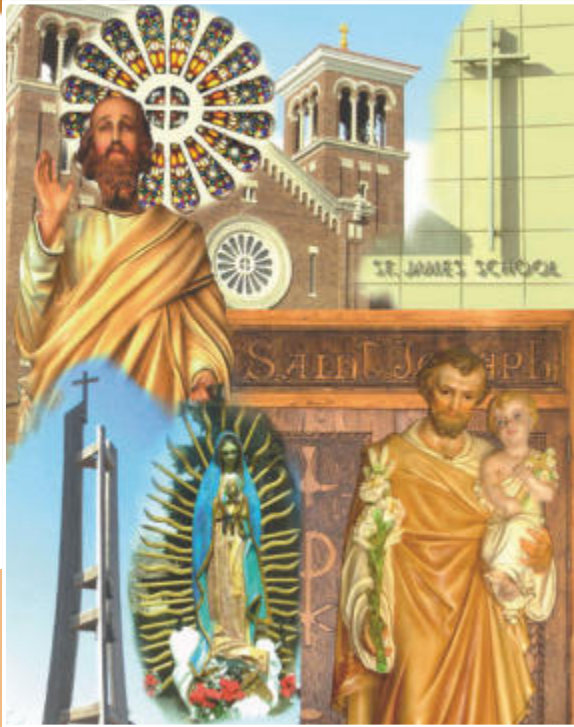

Evangelization

How Should We Evangelize?

Talk to People about Jesus, Part 2

Not all of the following examples will apply to every individual or to every stage or state of life. They are intended as a general outline of the relationships in which we are called to talk to people about Jesus.

1. Talk to Your Immediate Family about Jesus

Evangelization begins at home. Not all of us are called to travel to the ends of the earth as missionaries, but we are all called to share the Gospel with those closest to us. This applies especially to parents:

By virtue of their ministry of educating, parents are, through the witness of their lives, **the first heralds of the Gospel for their children**. Furthermore, by praying with their children, by reading the word of God with them and by introducing them deeply through Christian initiation into the Body of Christ—both the Eucharistic and the ecclesial Body—they become fully parents, in that they are begetters not only of bodily life but also of the life that through the Spirit's renewal flows from the Cross and Resurrection of Christ. — Pope St. John Paul II, Apostolic Exhortation *Familiaris Consortio* (1981), 39.

2. Talk to Your Extended Family about Jesus

When extended families are divided over matters of faith, it can be especially challenging to talk about Jesus on account of the fear of disturbing the peace of a family gathering or of damaging relationships that we care about deeply. Of course, we must use prudence in discerning the right time and place for sensitive conversations, but the depth of our love for our extended families and our concern for their ultimate salvation will not allow us to remain silent forever.

3. Talk to Your Friends about Jesus

The scope of our efforts to evangelize through our words should extend as far as the circles of our influence, and that certainly includes our friendships. Our friends are usually the people we speak to most often after our immediate family members. Friendships usually develop around shared interests and so we naturally want to talk to our friends about whatever those interests are, whether books, or movies, sports or politics, gardening or anything else. All this is natural and good, but conversation about Jesus should not take the last place in our friendships. Ask your non-Catholic friends (in a non-threatening way) what they believe about God and why. Be prepared to share your faith with them as well. Ask your fallen-away Catholic friends why they have stopped going to church, or why you have not seen them recently at church? Be prepared to listen patiently and gently encourage them to come back.

Ask your Catholic friends about the challenges of their day-to-day experience of following Jesus: how do you make time for prayer? What spiritual books are you reading? What do you do for evening or bedtime prayers? How often do you go to confession or to Mass? By asking questions such as these you can encourage your friends in their own pursuit of holiness, and you might also learn things that challenge you to greater holiness of life as well.

Next week we will look at two more examples of how we can talk to people about Jesus.

October: Month of the Rosary

On October 7th we celebrate the Memorial of Our Lady of The Rosary. Our devotion to the Blessed Mother through the prayers of The Rosary is summarized powerfully by the testimony of Colleen Shaddox, freelance writer from Hamden Connecticut: "My mother had a deep devotion to the Blessed Virgin, as did all the women in our family. When she gave me my first rosary, I was inducted into an adult sisterhood. They were all so strong, and that strength had to come from somewhere." The Memorial was established by Saint Pope Pius V in 1573 and then extended to the universal Church by Pope Clement XI in 1716. The present form of The Rosary with fifteen Mysteries, Joyful, Sorrowful and Glorious was developed during the 15th and 16th centuries. In 2002 Saint Pope John Paul II extended the devotion with the five Mysteries of Light.

Hoy encontramos en la Liturgia detalles específicos de la paciencia y pedagogía de Dios con su pueblo. La realidad que pasaba el pueblo en la vida del desierto, es algo muy parecido a la existencia humana de la sociedad de hoy. ¿Quién profetiza? ¿Quién tiene la autoridad para hablar del Señor? ¡Celo apostólico, o envidia! Josué pide a

Moisés que Eldad y Medad no fueran catequistas, o evangelizadores por decirlo así. Pero el Espíritu de Dios estaba en ellos --- como lo está ahora en todo bautizado. La respuesta de Moisés fue la siguiente: "Ojalá que todo el pueblo de Yavé fuera profeta, que Yavé les diera a todos su espíritu" (Números 11:29).

En una de sus tantas catequesis, el Papa Francisco lo explica así: "De buena fe, con celo, se quisiera proteger la autenticidad de una cierta experiencia, tutelando al fundador o al líder de falsos imitadores. Pero al mismo tiempo está como el temor de la competencia, que alguno pueda robar nuevos seguidores, y entonces no se logra apreciar el bien que los otros hacen; no va bien porque no es de los nuestros, se dice (9/30/2018). Por el otro lado, la respuesta de Jesús a Juan es similar a la de Josué y del Papa: "No se lo prohíban, ya que nadie puede hacer un milagro en mi nombre y luego hablar mal de mí. El que no está contra nosotros está con nosotros" (Marcos 9:39-40). Actuar, hacer todo en nombre de Jesús, implica solo una cosa: fidelidad a su mensaje de amor, paz y justicia. Todo lo que se ha hecho, en este tiempo de pandemia, por amor a los demás es ser generosos al estilo de Jesús.

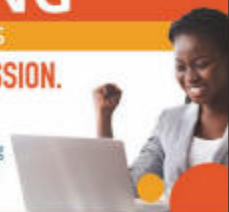
