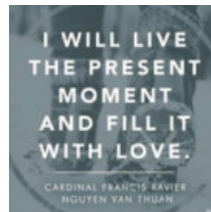

Red-Hot Evangelization

I love a good cup of coffee! A good cup of HOT coffee! Please do not add sugar or cream! It must be piping hot! As soon as the coffee enters my cup I take a few sips, savoring the hot deliciousness. The problem is that once the coffee leaves the pot and enters the cup there is potential for it to cool off. No problem. I have a coffee mug warmer next to my chair where I have my devotional time. Eventually, even with the warmer, the coffee cools off and I either resort to the microwave or take the final few gulps at a suboptimal temperature.



Can this “hot” thing extend even to our faith? Jesus did have something to say about that in the last book of the Bible. *“I know your works: you are neither cold nor hot. Would that you were either cold or hot! So, because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth”* (Revelation 3:15–16 ESV-CE). “Lukewarm actually comes from the Middle English word ‘lukewarme.’ The first part of the word, ‘luke,’ came from the word ‘lew,’ which meant tepid. That means **neither hot nor cold** . . . or about room temperature. And that’s what lukewarm means—neither hot nor cold” (wonderopolis.org).

We’ve all been around people who were enthusiastic, energetic, and excited about their relationship with Christ. They didn’t necessarily bounce off the walls with enthusiasm, or overwhelm us with their piety, but in a steady and winsome way they conveyed the importance of faith and how it should be lived out in the work-a-day world. What is the secret to having that kind of life and witness? How do we practice red-hot evangelization? What keeps us from becoming “lukewarm” or assume room temperature? And how ironic that “assume room temperature” is a euphemism for death!

Stay close to Jesus. Start your day with him. Spend your day in his presence. End your day with him. Entrust your sleeping hours to him. What happens when we don’t? As we move away from the source of our evangelical fervor — Jesus Christ — we take on the temperature of other influences in our lives: people, culture, preoccupations, fears, concerns, and most especially sin. When any of those things supersede our devotion to Jesus, we lose our “hotness” and become a negative influence in the lives of others. There will soon be nothing in our lives to draw others to the Lord. We are “no longer good for anything” (Matthew 5:13).

If you find yourself in a suboptimal condition, lukewarm in your relationship with Jesus, hear his invitation to you today from Revelation 3:20, *“Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with me.”* That invitation once accepted, will stir up the coals of faith and reignite hope in our dark, cold world of despair.

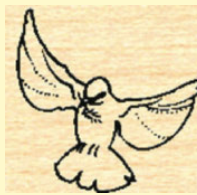

In the gospel this week we hear of Jesus’ baptism. Luke recounts for us that after Jesus was baptized and while He was praying, “heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon [Jesus] in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, “You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased (Luke 3:21-22).” Although the Holy Spirit does not descend upon us physically in the form of a dove at our own baptism, we do receive the Holy Spirit in a special way. Likewise, at our baptism we are marked as sons and daughters of God. This is a great gift and responsibility we have been given. **What do you think it means that you are a son or daughter of God? How is your being a child of God similar to, and different from, Jesus being the Son of God?**

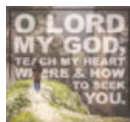

El Bautismo del Señor

9 de Enero 2022, Año C



Con la celebración del Bautismo del Señor se da por terminado el tiempo de Navidad. El Bautismo de Jesús es como una nueva epifanía, es decir, una nueva manifestación de Dios por medio de Jesús ahora en el Jordán. “El Espíritu Santo bajó sobre él y se manifestó

exteriormente en forma de paloma, y del cielo vino una voz: Tú eres mi Hijo, hoy te he dado la vida” (Lucas 3,22). La revelación del Padre se manifiesta proclamando a Jesús como su Hijo.

El Papa Francisco en una de sus catequesis lo muestra en tres puntos muy importantes para todos los que hemos sido bautizados en Cristo Jesús: “Jesús quiso recibir el bautismo predicado y administrado por Juan el Bautista en el Jordán. ¡Cuánta humildad tiene Jesús! Y al hacerlo, manifestó lo que hemos celebrado en Navidad: sumergirse en el río de la humanidad”. Jesús, va con todo a lo que refiere la cuestión humana, menos en el pecado. “El Evangelio subraya que Jesús, apenas salió del agua vio rasgarse los cielos y el Espíritu que bajaba hacia él como una paloma. El Espíritu Santo desciende en plenitud sobre Jesús para darle la fortaleza de cumplir su misión”. Por medio de nuestra vocación es que tenemos nuestra misión en la vida. ¿Cómo la estamos cumpliendo? “La fiesta del bautismo de Jesús invita a cada cristiano a recordar su bautismo”. ¿Sabes, o recuerdas la fecha de tu bautismo? Hay que preguntar sobre ese día y de cómo se celebró la fiesta de hacernos hijos e hijas de Dios. (Papa Francisco 1/7/2018).

Bautismo-Paloma

En el evangelio de esta semana escuchamos sobre el bautismo de Jesús. Lucas nos cuenta que después de que Jesús fue bautizado y mientras Jesús oraba, “se abrió el cielo y el Espíritu Santo descendió sobre [Jesús] en forma de paloma. Y vino una voz del cielo: “Tú eres mi Hijo amado; en ti me

complazco” (Lucas 3: 21-22). Aunque el Espíritu Santo no desciende sobre nosotros físicamente en forma de paloma en nuestro propio bautismo, recibimos el Espíritu Santo de una manera especial. Asimismo, en nuestro bautismo somos marcados como hijos e hijas de Dios. Este es un gran regalo y una gran responsabilidad que se nos ha dado.

¿Qué crees que significa que eres hijo o hija de Dios?

¿En qué nos parecemos a Jesús como hijos de Dios y en que somos diferentes?

Espero ser como Él

“¿Quién es este Cristo? ¿Es como tú?

Quizás hayas escuchado esta historia, a menudo atribuida a la vida de Santa Teresa de Calcuta. Un hombre enfermo le hizo esta pregunta, mientras se maravillaba de su incansable servicio para él y los demás en el nombre de alguien llamado Jesucristo.

“Él no se parece en nada a mí,” se dice que respondió la santa. “Pero espero ser como Él.”

Aunque no se puede verificar la autenticidad de este intercambio, su mensaje suena perfectamente cierto: todo el valor de nuestra corresponsabilidad radica en su relatividad con aquel en cuyo nombre lo realizamos.

Considere la figura de Juan el Bautista, un personaje magnífico e imponente, incluso desde una perspectiva puramente literaria o histórica. Un mártir que se alimentaba de langostas salvajes y con valentía le decía la verdad al poder; un hombre tan grande que algunos lo confundieron con el Mesías.

Pero ¿por qué es grandioso? Porque preparó el camino. Todos sus logros y aventuras no significan nada si se sacan del contexto de la historia de la salvación. Solo tiene sentido en relación con Cristo, y esto es exactamente como él lo quería. “Viene uno más digno que yo,” insiste. Y debido a esa humildad y ese abrazo total de la voluntad de Dios, se le otorga uno de los mayores honores del Nuevo Testamento: bautiza al Hijo de Dios.

Examinemos nuestras vidas a la luz de su relatividad con Cristo. ¿Cómo preparamos el camino? Cuando Cristo viene a nosotros, ¿qué hacemos? ¿Cómo nos abrimos a ser actores en el plan de Dios?

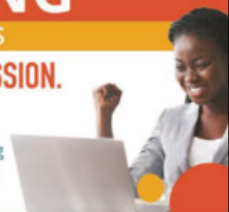
