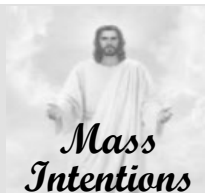

Catholics and the Bible

What do you know about the Bible? Often Catholics get a bad rap about our lack of belief or familiarity with the Holy Scriptures. Perhaps someone has told you that Catholics don't really believe the Bible or know what it teaches. Before I became Catholic, I confess that I had some of these misconceptions. I am currently reading a book by Shane Schaetzel, a Catholic author, apologist, and catechist. As we move into the summer months, I would like to share some of his insights on a variety of topics that can help us better understand our faith.

Do Catholics believe in the Bible?

Yes! In fact, Catholics invented the Bible. Shocking as that may sound, it is historically accurate to say that. The New Testament did not exist as a single compilation prior to AD 367. Before then, most of the writings of the New Testament were on parchment scrolls and scattered throughout the churches of the ancient Roman Empire. They were mixed together with other writings that were orthodox but not necessarily inspired Scripture. No two regions of the early Church had the exact same scrolls, nor the exact same number of scrolls. It was all rather chaotic.



In response to the Arian heresy in the early fourth century, the Catholic Church commissioned its bishops to find out which scrolls should belong to a universal New Testament that all Christians would use. Many committees were held to determine this based on Catholic Tradition.

In AD 367, a Catholic bishop in Northern Africa, St. Athanasius of Alexandria, approved (for his diocese) a particular set of twenty-seven scrolls, consisting of the writings of Matthew through Revelation. Three Catholic councils were then held to ratify this list, and in AD 405, these twenty-seven scrolls were declared to be the universal New Testament by Pope Innocent I. This is the same New Testament we all use today, Catholics and Protestants alike, including Evangelicals, thanks to the hard and faithful work of the Catholic Church sixteen hundred years ago.

Católicos y la Biblia

¿Qué sabes de la Biblia? A menudo, los católicos tienen una mala reputación por nuestra falta de creencia o familiaridad con las Sagradas Escrituras. Tal vez alguien le haya dicho que los católicos realmente no creen en la Biblia ni saben lo que enseña. Antes de convertirme en católico, confieso que tenía algunos de estos conceptos erróneos. Actualmente estoy leyendo un libro de Shane Schaezel, un autor católico, apologista y catequista. A medida que avanzamos en los meses de verano, me gustaría compartir algunas de sus ideas sobre una variedad de temas que pueden ayudarnos a comprender mejor nuestra fe.

¿Los católicos creen en la Biblia? ¡Sí! De hecho, los católicos inventaron la Biblia. Por chocante que pueda parecer, es históricamente exacto decir eso. El Nuevo Testamento no existía como una compilación única antes del año 367 d. C. Antes de esa fecha, la mayoría de los escritos del Nuevo Testamento estaban en rollos de pergamino y estaban esparcidos por las iglesias del antiguo Imperio Romano. Fueron mezclados con otros escritos que eran Escritura ortodoxa pero no necesariamente inspirada. No había dos regiones de la Iglesia primitiva que tuvieran exactamente los mismos rollos, ni exactamente el mismo número de rollos. Todo fue bastante caótico.

En respuesta a la herejía arriana a principios del siglo IV, la Iglesia Católica encargó a sus obispos que averiguaran qué rollos deberían pertenecer a un Nuevo Testamento universal que usarían todos los cristianos. Se realizaron muchos comités para determinar esto en base a la Tradición Católica.

En el año 367 dC, un obispo católico del norte de África, San Atanasio de Alejandría, aprobó (para su diócesis) un conjunto particular de veintisiete rollos, que consta de los escritos de Mateo hasta Apocalipsis. Luego se llevaron a cabo tres concilios católicos para ratificar esta lista, y en el año 405 d. C., el Papa Inocencio I declaró que estos veintisiete rollos eran el Nuevo Testamento universal. Este es el mismo Nuevo Testamento que todos usamos hoy, católicos y protestantes por igual. incluidos los evangélicos, gracias al arduo y fiel trabajo de la Iglesia Católica hace mil seiscientos años.
