

Today's Solemn Feast of the Baptism of the Lord Jesus


Today's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which concludes our Christmas season, at times seems a bit out-of-place, since Jesus was baptized some 30 years after his birth.

However, Christmas is a celebration of God manifesting himself to the world through Jesus Christ; his birth in Bethlehem certainly is the highlight of the Christmas Season, but his manifestation at the Jordan River is also part of the mystery of God coming among us. The Lord is presented as coming forth from water, a biblical symbol of God's life, and John the Baptist presents him as God's greatest gift to the world. "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased" (Luke 3:22).

Since we are baptized into Christ, we share through adoption in his relationship with God. We are adopted sons and daughters of God through our communion with Christ the true Son of God, and through him we are heirs to all the gifts that God can possibly give to humanity.

Prayer for the Feast of the Lord's Baptism

Almighty ever-living God, who, when Christ had been baptized in the River Jordan and as the Holy Spirit descended upon him, solemnly declared him your beloved Son, grant that your children by adoption, reborn of water and the Holy Spirit, may always be well pleasing to you. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen



St. Hilary of Poitiers | January 13

Born a pagan, St. Hilary (c. 315 - c. 367) studied philosophy and the meaning of life, eventually making his way through the bible. He became a convert and was appointed bishop of Poitiers in 353. Sometimes referred to as the Hammer of the Arians, St. Hilary defended the Nicene Creed against a popular heresy, Arianism. He was exiled to Phrygia for opposing Roman emperor Constantius II, who preferred the heresy which denies Christ's divinity. From Phyrgia St. Hilary fought with his

pen, zealously writing against the heresy.

Eventually he was allowed to return to Poitiers, but did so by a circuitous route, preaching against Arianism all the way. St. Hilary was likely the first writer of hymns in the West, his writings on the Trinity, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew survive today. St. Hilary was created Doctor of the Church, a title given to those who provided important contributions to theology and doctrine, in 1851 by Pope Pius IX.


