


GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

May 9, 2021 6th Sunday of Easter

"Remain in my love," and, "I call you friends," are powerful words that are found in John's Gospel. Most of us probably have them committed to memory or have at least heard them proclaimed dozens of times. They are words that can easily become trite and quickly glossed over without fully pondering and digesting their profound beauty. When we take the time to immerse ourselves in them, they can radically change our lives and our relationships. They can open up new doors of adventure and hold countless possibilities for meaning. The essence of love and friendship are things that can easily be taken for granted. They have always been there and are a significant part of our lives. Many would say that they could not live without love and friendship, and they put a great deal of care into preserving, deepening and sustaining them. Love and friendship share a mutual relationship with each other that deserves more reflection.

Where does love come from? We can consider relationships that have not succeeded and conclude that they were somehow due to our "failures in love." In doing so, we assume that human beings are the ones responsible for love, its success and also its failure. While our weakness, emotional composition and sinfulness can easily impact our ability to love, its origin is not human. God is love. God is love's author and origin. When we love, it is God who loves in and through us. It is because of this divine closeness that Jesus is able to call us friends! It is not because of anything we have done but simply because of who we are. Realizing and contemplating this awesome reality becomes a game changer across the board. It gives us reason to clear the table of anything that can adversely affect the way we love so that we can open the door for its author to shine forth.

Coming upon this truth is what leads folks like St. Francis of Assisi to leave that which is comfortable and worldly and live a radical life. They relate with the love of God that radiates in and through all living things and appreciate their sacredness. It was having an intimate experience of God's love and friendship that propelled St. Francis and others to embrace simplicity, act nonviolently, pursue humility, love enemies, care for the earth and open up avenues for true justice. Understanding this profound truth will also help us find peaceful solutions to world's problems, restore relationships with our sisters and brothers, bring the grace of loving stewardship to creation and heal many wounds. Once we begin to see how wonderfully holy all of life really is, we discover joy. We lose our need for fear, develop a fierce fortitude, act prudently and seek justice. There is great power in love because it comes from God. It will never fail. It also enjoys the company of two other friends who are eager to become our friends as well: faith and hope. These are just as important to have and to share.

Dear Friends in Christ,

A couple of weeks ago I mentioned in my letter the happy news that we had met and exceeded our goal for the 2020 Diocesan Stewardship Appeal. Again let me just say how thrilled I am about that! A first in a long while, and during a pandemic of all times. Perhaps there is a greater sense that we just need to get this done; it is what it is as they say, and let's just do it. Well, we here at St. Mary are an integral part of the larger Church, of the bigger Vine if you will, and it is good that we do our part faithfully to support the greater mission of the Vine. I am very pleased about this; I know it is not easy, and yet together we make it happen.

Now I would like to mention, in no particular order, several building and maintenance projects for which we are in process of gathering quotes and other information. A few of these may be obvious, others not so much:

Parking Lot – This is the biggest item by far, no surprise. You can see for yourselves that work needs to be done to repair and improve the lot. This could become a safety liability soon if we do not seriously address it. While we would love to rebuild the entire lot, that process would cost upwards into the several hundred thousand of dollars. I will not push that on you. I will put it out there, and we will do what we can, if that means doing a section at a time. But we must do something about in the near future.

Condensate Piping – The condensate line that runs from the school under the alley back to the boiler in the church has recently had some leak issues. We are getting some initial pricing on this, as well as finding out just to what extent is the issue. This is old piping and it might be getting time to rework it. The cost could be significant, but we will see; hopefully it will not be.

Tuck Pointing – We need to have some of this done on the outside of the church and the school.

Old Boiler Chimney – We are looking into removing the top of the chimney to the old church boiler. It is no longer in use of course, and it has many cracks. We do not use it, so there is no use in repairing it. But if we leave it as it is it may collapse, and naturally we want to avoid that.

New Roof on Parish Center Building – This is overdue. We've been holding back as long as we can, but we can't do that too much longer. We should get this done in the next couple of years.

Cemetery Cross – Some of you might have noticed that the cemetery cross structure has some significant cracks in it. If the structure were to collapse we could lose the beautiful glass cross that has stood as a sign of hope and victory for many years in our beloved cemetery. We cannot lose this cross! It has been quite a process for our team finding out just how to handle this, but happily we are now at a point where we can soon move forward in refortifying the structure and thereby securing the cross again.

Church Sound System – If we cannot hear, we cannot understand. Therefore we are looking into upgrading our sound system in the church just a bit. Nothing major, but hopefully enough to make a noticeable difference in sound quality and reception.

The rectory could use a few updates as well, but I have been holding off on those for the time being. Still I might need a new appliance or two soon, they're just getting old. But you know me, I don't like to overspend, to use funds that we don't have (I could never work for the federal government).

That's all for now. Just wanting to keep you informed, and let you know that even if you don't hear me talk much about these items, we are assessing the issues little by little and proceeding forward as we can.
