Habits

When I was growing up, I remember my parents always telling me what needed to be done or how I was to do something. Most of the time it felt like nagging or they never appreciated the way I was doing something and their way seemed more right than mine. It is when you get older and the habits they may have taught you make more sense, because it was more harmonious with everything or everyone around you in what you were doing. For example, your job is to move a pile of rocks from one side to another. There are many ways you can do this. You can pick up one at a time and carry them over or you could roll them, you can put them in a cart and carry more at one time. But out of all the ways of doing the job there may be one way that is the most optimal. Your parents may teach you the habit of looking things over before reacting to a job. For some that may be natural and for others not so much. But it is creating the good habit that will be able to benefit all. Again, I could throw the rocks but if my aim is off I could damage other people's property or my own, even though I was accomplishing the goal.

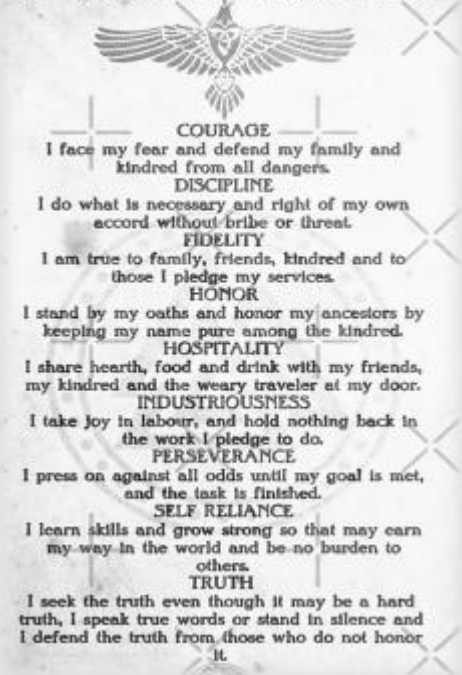
The same for us in how we act with others, ourselves, and with God. We need the habits to live our life well on earth with God and others. We can have good habits and unfortunately we can have bad habits, which many of us can always point out easier than the good ones. The habits that have a firm disposition to do the good are called virtues. The habits that are acquired by repeated sin in violation of the proper norms of human morality is called a vice.

Either we need to work on exercising the virtues or we need to grow in our capacity to perform good works that are virtuous. We may illustrate by comparing the virtues to the limbs of the body: our feet enable us to walk, our hands to grasp, but it is only by frequent exercise that we acquire a facility in performing these actions. Meaning, we get better at the virtue the more we exercise it, like Prudence, Temperance, Justice, and Fortitude. The theological virtues require one to grow in capacity by asking God to grow in Faith, Hope, and Charity.

To grow in the spiritual life, we need to practice and grow in the good habits of virtue, however we could have grown in the bad habits of vice. But the removal of ingrained disposition of sin or vice requires much effort and self-denial, until the contrary virtue is acquired. God's mercy should give us hope to know that we can overcome any vice with the help of God's grace to grow in virtue. I will be going over some virtues, good habits, in the bulletins so that we may be more aware of the ways we can exercise the good habits in our life and be the light to others. I encourage you to see how many virtues that are out there. Happy hunting.

Also, thank those who have defended our country that we may have the rights to exercise the good in our country through our Catholic religion. God and man. Happy Independence Day.
